Rebellious Natives Given An Ultimatum

SOLO, Philippines, (AP)—Efforts to obtain removal of native warriors from the armed Moro village of Tayungan falling, Colonel Luther Stevens Tuesday served an ultimatum on the entrenched native warriors that his force of the constabulary would attack at 11 a. m. Of course, if you want to change to the Republican party once and for all that's your privilege.

"Vote for the man, not the party." You've heard that a lot of times. Those who issue that admonition do not consider that any group of voters whether it contains ten or ten thousand, or a million people, form in effect a political party who they all support the same man for public office.

You say you're going to vote for the man, not the party. You've got the card before the horse to begin with. You may think you are following this "man not the party" doctrine. Then you find thousands of your fellow citizens voted for the same fellow. Well, insofar as that election is concerned you and the rest who supported that man form a political party.

You can do more, separate party from government in this country than you can separate Red Sheridan from the Sweetwater high football team.

Back to Texas' ills, politically. Judging from all the things each side called the other in the recent race for governor you'd think they couldn't agree on anything.

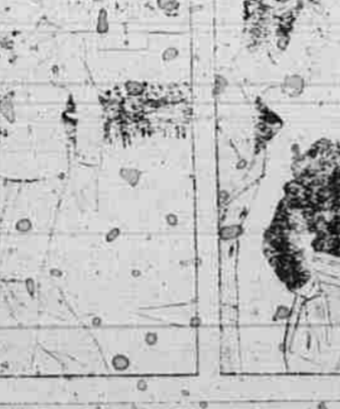

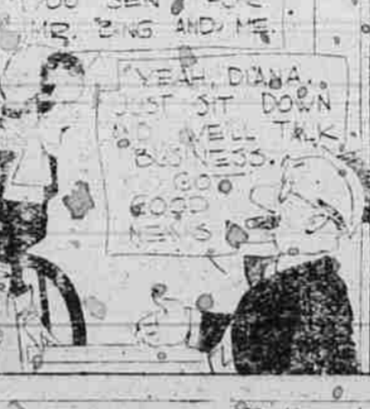

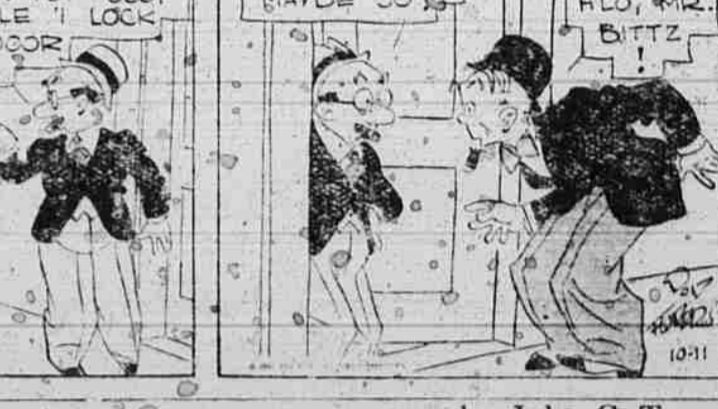
