## L. V. STOCKARD

This space is used in memorial of one of the best citizens Santa Anna and west Texas ever knew, a pioneer citizen and one whose name is and has been familiar in Santa Anna every since the town has been in existence. This man is L. V. Stockard. Mr. Stockard was run down and killed by by a freight train about 6:30 o'clock Wednesday evening as he was on his way home. He was crossing the track while the train crew was switching. and failed to take notice of the approach of the cars that were backing which caught him. knockhim down and crushed his lower limbs to peaces. Both legs were badly mutulated, his right hand crushed with other bruises on his body which caused his death almost instantly. According to a statement made by D. R. Hill who was close by and witnessed the tragedy, and also ran to Mr. Stockard's aid and pulled him out from under the cars, Mr. Stockard only uttered a brief statement, stating, "They Have Killed Me." The funeral will be held at the Baptist church, Friday at 2:30 p.m. Mr. Stockard has lived in Santa Anna about forty years, was the first Station Agent and Operator this place ever had, has several children and all but one will have time to get here for the funeral. He was a faithful member of the Baptist church, a Mason and a man whose life has ever been above question or reproach. This is only a brief statement prepared by the editor whose heart is heavy with sad grief. A more lengthly mention will appear in these columns next week.

The boy was unarmed but the old man had a six shooter. I think it was about a mile east of where Whon ALSO COMEDY. is located the Indians shot the boy in the back and took his horse. The old man McCain stood them off with his six shooter and they finally rode on and McCain went home and got several white men together and followed this bunch of Indians overtaking them and they had quite a pitched battle. The white men shot a horse from under one of the Indian's and he ran and jumped upon another horse. The horse that was killed had been stolen from Uncle Bob Wiley out in Runnells County and we knew the horse by the orand. Upon another occasion in the early Seventies after John Chisholm had opened up a store at Trickham and several white people had moved into the county, a bunch of Indians crossed the Creek near the store and near a small school that was being taught by a man by the name of Dave McAlister. They stopped and tried to catch a mule that belonged to John Chisholm, the mule was gently but he kicked at the Indians who tried to catch him. Lark Williams, one of the school boys had a six shooter and got to shooting at the Indian and between Mark's six shooter and the mule's heels the Indian was bluffed off and never succeeded in getting the mule. As well as I can remember this was about the last Indian raid made through the Trickham
