The Santa Fe will run a Special Train over its lines in Texas during this month for the benefit of people who are interested in better poultry, better hogs and better cattle. The Special Train is scheduled to be in Santa Anna Monday mornng, March 19, at 10 o'clock, and will stay here for about two hours, co-operating with the railroad officials, the A. & M. College will send some of their best men to lecture on the various subjects the San-ta Fe wishes to be discussed. The movement is purely educational and we hope to see every farmer in this territory present when the train arrives. No matter whether you are directly interested in either branch of industry represented, it will pay you to come out and see and hear for yourself just what is said, and maybe you will become interested and extend your efforts to cover some of these important sidelines in connection with your other farm work. We know this is a good country but conditions can be improved by inculcating more scientific and diversified methods of farming. One or two good cows, a good sow and several good hens will add considerably to the profits and living qualities of any farm. Come out to the demonstration - and lecture train, and we believe you will be paid for your time.

We will be joined in our next issue by almost every business in town, in our invitation to the people of this vicinity to be present at the demonstration train, and we hope to see a united attendance of the entire citizenship, men, women and children.






