Article 5. Any person found guilty of violating any of the foregoing provisions, articles and parts of articles, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding Ten Dollars.

Article 6. The fact that there is no ordinance in force in Santa Anna prohibiting throwing waste paper and other combustible substances on the streets and further prohibiting the collection of decaying matter on premises and regulating the burning of same creates an emergency and demands that all rules requiring an ordinance to be read and referred to committee and to be reported at subsequent meeting be suspended and same is accordingly done and this ordiance put upon its passage.
