WIU Has Meter **Testing Crew** Here This Week

"Pardon .me, lady, while I put up a brand, spanking new electric meter."

This, or words to that effect, is what members of a metertesting crew will be telling women in Santa Anna during the next few days, according to W. R. Mulroy, local manager for the West Texas Utilities Company.

A special crew in a motorized machine shop has arrived in town to test all electric meters for accuracy and possible need of repairs. The crew is under the supervision of Forest Campbell and has been making a house-to-house canvass of homes served by WTU during the last 20 months and now

has tested over 25,000 meters. The tests are made periodically in conjunction; with the State Bureau of Weights and Measures and assure customers of the company that their meters are as nearly accurate as mechanically possible. The "stroboscope," being used in the Southwest for the first time, now is known to test electric meters within 25-100ths of one per cent absolute accuracy.

Testing equipment is located n a huge trailer which will be opened for inspection while here. Campbell said visitors will be welcomed after working hours when workmen will have time to explain the complicated system of tests.

"Procedure in testing meters has been greatly improved, dong with advanced methods n providing customers with prat class electric service." said Campbell, "and it now is possible to test as many as 80 meters a day compared to 25 or 30 a few years ago. The work here will, proceed along these lines:

"A pick-up truck, loaded with new meters, will call at the home of customers. Our 'contact' man will arrange with the home-owner to exchange meters. It would be surprising to the av® erage citizen, if he knew the amount of oil, carbide, salt water and other polluting substances that go down the storm sewers of our cities. All this goes down the streams and here it is to be used for drinking water and for the use of live-stock. Factories, manufactur-ing plants and refineries contribute much to the pollution of our streams.

Effect of Salt Water On Fresh Water Fish

It would be rather foolish to say that fresh water fish are caught in the oceans, because everyone knows that this is impossible. If fresh water fish cannot live in oceans, how does one expect fresh water fish to exist in water that is three times as salty as the ocean water? However, this is what is expected of many of our streams in this country, especially smaller streams that used to produce a large volume of our fresh water fish before oil fields were discovered in certain areas, and are now nonproductive and vegetation gone from the streams, and much of the land near the streams. TRUCKING interests demand legislative authority to increase the existing truck load limit on Texas highways, arrogantly ignoring the fact that highway hazards to life and limb grow greater year by year.

On the highways of Texas in 1937, the last year for which authentic figures are available, 670 persons men, women and children . . . lost their lives in accidents in which trucks were involved . . . and 3,360 others were injured . . . many of them permanently disabled.

In the past six years 1932 to 1937, inclusive the number of persons killed annually in truck accidents increased from 241 to 670 and those injured from killed annually in truck accidents increased from 241 to 070... and those injured from 887 to 3,360. These indisputable figures ... taken from actual accounts of truck accidents published in Texas newspapers ... show that in the six-year period 2,936 persons lost their lives and 15,183 were injured in truck crashes on the highways of our state. The number killed is greater than the population of Odessa, Gatesville, Lampasas, La Grange, Raymondville or a score of other thriving Texas cities . . . while the number killed and injured exceeds the population of Sherman, Marshell, Corsicans or Paris, all fanking business centers of the state.

Analysis of official records of accidents in which trucks were involved reveals a further vital fact.... that the heaviest and largest trucks, as a class, operating over Texas highways in 1937, showed a death rate of four and one-half times that of all trucks, large and small, and almost seven times that for all motor vehicles, including trucks.

The combination of weight and size of motor vehicles is thus definitely proved to to the controlling factor in fatal highway accidents . . . , the heavier the vehicle the barder it hits the more surely it kills or cripples.

The statutes now in effect have governed truck operations on Texas highways since 1981 and the ever-growing tell of truck accidents, injuries and deaths, reflects only the increasing ingenuity of the operators of overloaded trucks in evading or openly defying the laws created to control them in the interest of public safety. Large trucks use your highways only by your permission expressed through your legislature.

Towns elikens and taxpayers have built and maintained Texas highways. They are definitely entitled to the safe use of them and not to be driven from them by those who seek to operate upon them for softich gain.
