Through the American principle of private initiative in business, electric rate eteductions have been continued along with improvement in service. According to the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, electric service costs for the United States as a whole are now $39 \%$ lower while the cost of living now is $38 \%$ higher than in 1913.

According to the National Industrial Conference Aoard food is now 25\% higher than 1933, clothing $22 \%$ higher, and rent $8 \%$ higher. Total taxes, including the numerous rederal tazes the consumers pay indirectly, have increased at an alarming tate and for the average family now amount to more than ten times the cost of electric service
