Tulare, Calif. Dec. 3. Hugh Phillips, Jr., 16 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Phillips, Sr., 130 North California St., was killed last night when his motor scooter and an automobile collided at the intersection of B and Kern Streets.

The driver of the car, Dewey Wayne Steward, 19 of Churchill Camp, was arrested on charges of failing to yield the right of way and with driving without an operator's license. Officers said they may file a manslaughter charge against Steward later to-

The accident occured at 5:45 p. m. as Stewart was driving west on Kern Street and the youth was going north on B Street.

In addition to his parents, the victim is survived by two sisters, Mrs. C. T. Moore of Santa Anna, Texas and Mrs. I. E. Myers of Tulare; and a brother, William C. Phillips of Chino, Calif.

God's universe is not a neat garden in which only flowers grow; he has to work cutting down the weeds. His universe is not a realm at peace, with no need even for police; treason ls abroad, rebellion breaks out here and there.

The Greeks used to think that the gods never went to any trouble, they ruled without effort. But the Christian Bible tells of a God who does have troubles, who meets opposition and fights against it.

Bright Books for Dark Times WO books in our Bible bring this out in a startling way: Daniel and Revelation. We have been thinking through three months now about various kinds of literature in the Bible. The kind represented by these two books is calleda: "Apocalyptic." Scholara" have discovered a number of sim-Har books, but these two are incomparably the greatest and were the only two to be admitted to the Bible: One feature of all apocalyptic literature is that it always appears in dark times, and its first, readers are people down at the bottom of the heap, people beyond all

Daniel, long before the time of Christ, and Revelation, two generations later than Christ, came as lights in a very dark world. The first of these books circulated when the Jews were hard pressed by Syrian persecutors, and when the other came out, the Christians were about to be crushed out of ex-Istence by cruel Roman em-

Observing what went on in those days, you might have thought the Jews, or the Christians as the case might be, had no prospects of sur-viving. But these books brought a brighter message: Have courage! God will not lose!

A Code in Pictures

DANIEL and Revelation are both hard to understand, and for the same reason. Their messages are framed not always in solain language but in symbols: Hidden meanings abound.

This had to be so; if one of these books fell (as sometimes they did) into the hands of the persecuting agents of the Syrdan or Roman governments, it would not get the owner tuto trouble, for the agent would hardly be able to interpret the strange language.

All sorts of weird creatures and events move through these mysterious pages, and they often probably refer to persons or events known to the writers and the first xenders: beasts with iron teeth and norns with eyes; a flaming throne bet on a river of fire; golden vials filled with the wrath of God; e red dragon sweeping the stars down
