



**Notice Of Hearing**

To all persons, firms and corporations owning, claiming or having any interest in and to all lien holders that the City Commission of the City of Santa Anna, Coleman County, Texas has by Ordinance No. 155 enacted the 10th day of November, 1948, ordered the improvements of a portion of the City Streets, and has let contract for such improvements to the City of Santa Anna, and the City will levy assessments for a part of the cost of such improvements on the front foot plan, against the abutting property and owners thereof.
