



Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas authorizing the legislature to provide for Civil, Service in certain counties of the scape thereof.

BE TERESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS.
Section J. That Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas be and the same is keroby altended by adding to said Article a new Section, to be known and designated as Section, to be known and designated as Section 62-c, reading as follows:

"Section 62-c, The Levi-lature is authorized to gracials for the creation of Civil Service Systems for county employees in the respective counties of this State, but any system so authorized and established shall be accounted for the creation of Civil Service System established by viring of this Section shall apply to appearance of office heretofore-provided by Service System of a file and county. Any Civil, Service System established by viring of this Section shall not apply the Albe duration of such offices shall be proved by the provisions of such Givil Service System. This Section and not apply to countie, having a population less than seventy-five thousand (73000) levole.

The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electorate of the State at an election to be held on the second Tuesday in November, 1949, at which election all hallots shall have printed or written thereby for in countles using voting machines the said machines shall, provide for the following:

"FOR The Constitutional Amendment authorizing the Legislature to provide for Civil Service in counties upon a vote of the people therein", and "AGAINST The Constitutional Amendment authorizing the Legislature to provide for Civil Service in counties upon a vote of the people therein."

Each voter shall mark out one of said clauses on the hallot, leaving the one expressing his vote on the proposed Amendment, and if it shall appear from the returns of said election that a majority of the votes cast are in favor of said Amendment, the same shall become a part of the Constitution of the State of Texas.

Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of this State.
