Tom Stewardson **Homes Destroyed** By Fire Friday

Two ranch homes valued at 25,000 and located only a few feet from each other, burned to the ground Friday night on the Tom Stewardson place near Santa

Stewardson, a Coleman County ranchman said he would build

Stewardson's homes were located about 12 miles south of Santa Anna.

The fire presumably started in a stately new nine-room home which was not quite completed. Stewardson was building the new home only a few feet from his old

Witnesses said the new house, which the Stewardson family had expected to move in before Christmas, was the first to catch fire. Origin was unknown. Opinion was expressed that it was ion was expressed that it was caused by spontaneous combus-

Mrs. Stewardson was in the old home at the time. She was aroused by passing neighbors who saw

The fire started about 7 o'clock. It apparently caught at the north end of the new house, burned to the south end, then jumped to the old residence. Both were complete losses.
