Santa Anna Oil News By Elgean Shield

The F. C. Glass and Norton, Well No. 1, 530 ft. west of the Ward School discovery well in the Santa Anna townsite, took a 21 ft. saturated core out of the Breneke Sand Monday night and the geologist estimated the well to be from 300 to-500 barrels of oil per day, The first core from 1779 ft. to 1789 ft., to 12 ft deeper, showed about 21/2 ft. of stray saturation in the center of the core. The second core, beginning at 1796 ft had the best saturation of about 21 ft. This has already

caused a very energtic lease play. The Greater Expectations Oil Co., on the Hickman land, 4 miles NE of the City of Santa An-na, was drilling Monday at around 1205 ft. in the blue shell. Brannon and Murray, on the Abernathy land, Wm. H. King Survey, 155 acre tract and 2 miles south-east of Coleman was 1.145 day.
