Mayor F. Z. Payne Calls Special Election Concerning Aldermanic Form of Govern.

A petition bearing the names of 106 qualified voters of the City of Santa Anna, asking for an election to be called to determine whether the voters of Santa Anna would favor the Aldermanic form of city government or not, was presented to Mayor F. Z. Payne early this week.

Mayor Payne acted on the petition immediately, and called the election for January 6, 1951. The election will be held at the Fire Station part of the City Hall, and Leroy Stockard will be in charge of the election.

Any city operating under the Commission form of government may adopt the Aldermanic form of government, when authorized to do so by a majority vote at an election held for this purpose. At least 10 per cent of the qualified voters of a city must petition the present form of government to call this election.

In the event that such an election carries, the present Mayor and (in the case of Santa Anna) one commissioner, Wallace W. Adams, street commissioner, will continue to serve in their respective positions, until their tenure of office has expired. The other commissioner, B. A. Parker, has resigned effective December 14.

Provided the election carries, plans are being made also to incorporate the City Manager plan, but this must be done after the Aldermanic form of government is approved by the voters. Under the City Manager plan, the town will be divided into four wards, and an alderman will be elected from each ward, and a Mayor will be elected at large. Under the Aldermanic form of government, the city council will consist of the Mayor and five aldermen, elected

at large. These six persons would be the ones to divide the town into wards.

Proclamation Of Special Election

This, the 4th day of December, A. D. 1950, came on to be considered by the Mayor of the City of Santa Anna, Texas, the petition of more than ten (10%) per cent of the total number of legally qualified electors of the said city, for an order of election in the said City of Santa Anna, Texas, for the purpose of enabling the electors thereof to determine whether the Aldermanic Form of city government shall be adopted, as provided for in Texas Rev. Civ. Stat. 1925, Article 1154; and it appearing to the undersigned, Mayor of the City of Santa Anna, Texas, that such petition has been duly certified by the City Clerk of said city, on it receipt by him this 4th day of December, 1950; and the same appearing to be in good order, and sufficient as required by the law governing such cases:

NOW, THEREFORE BY VIRTUE OF THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME BY LAW, I, F. Z. PAYNE, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SANTA ANNA, TEXAS, DO HEREBY ORDER THAT, ON THE 6th DAY OF JANUARY, A. D. 1951, IN THE CITY OF SANTA ANNA, TEXAS, AN ELECTION BE HELD FOR THE PURPOSE OF ENABLING THE ELECTORS OF THE SAID CITY OF SANTA ANNA, TEXAS, TO DETERMINE IF THE AFORE MENTIONED ALDERMANIC FORM OF CITY GOVERNMENT SHALL BE A-

Sparkman shall be judge of the election; and M. W. Curry and Mrs. Hardy Blue shall be clerks, all of the foregoing being proper persons for such purposes and qualified voters of the city and county.

No person shall vote at such election unless he be a resident of the City of Santa Anna, Texas, and be also a qualified voter under the constitution and laws of the State of Texas. All votes of such election shall be by ballot, and voters desiring the adoption of the Aldermanic form of government shall strike out and mark through the line on the ballot reading as follows: "AGAINST Aldermanic form," and voters not desiring the adoption of the aforementioned Aldermanic form shall strike out and mark through the line on the ballot reading as follows: "FOR Aldermanic form."

Jesus' New Year Lesson for January 7, 1951

SCRIPTURE: Mark 1:1-20. DEVOTIONAL READING: Isaiah 42: 1-9.

THERE is no room in this one thin column for a commentary on the whole Sunday school lesson each week. If the reader is interested, as it is hoped he will be, he will first study the Bible passages themselves, with whatever aids his own denomination furnishes him. The Sunday school teacher or Bible student who wishes to do really thorough work will need a Bible Dictionary and at least a one-volume commentary on the entire Bible. (Dummelew's [Macmillan Co.] and the Abingdon Commentary [Abingdon Press], are among the best of these.) As a background for the studies of the next three months, the student should read one or more good "Lives" of Christ. Write to your own church bookstore for suggestions.

When Is New Year's Day?

EVERY day is a New Year's Day for somebody. The legal holiday that goes by that name seldom comes at a real turning-point in any one's life.

The real occasion is when some momentous change occurs, so that after that day life never flows in its old channels. In this sense, a very important New Year's Day for Jesus was the day when he was baptized in the Jordan river.

Before that day he lived as a carpenter in one village; after that day, as a public man, indeed THE public Man of all times. The pattern of his life completely changed.

Decisions

NEW YEAR'S is a good time to review three things: your decisions, your life's work, and your friendships.

Have you put off a decision for a long time? Now is the time to face it. Have you been making "unfortunate" decisions, choices you regret? Now is a good time to look into these and see why you have been taking the wrong road too often. Have you any bed-rock principle on which you base all your decisions? — Jesus' New Year was marked by certain decisions made once and for all.

To begin with, there was his baptism. One thing it surely meant: Jesus that day decided deliberately to be counted among those who need repentance rather than among those who think they don't. Not everybody came down to the Jordan to be baptized. Some came only to criticize. Jesus sided with the sinners, not the critics. It was a life-long decision. He became known as the "Friend of sinners."

There were also the further decisions in the wild country where he went through his temptations.

THERE is a great thrill in setting out on the work one is going to do for the rest of one's natural life. Out of the harbor traffic on to the open sea! Jesus now becomes a preacher, and this was his work for the rest of his life. His carpentry has long since mouldered to dust; his preaching and teaching are immortal.

But suppose Jesus had been a slipshod, inefficient, careless carpenter? Would he have ever become a great teacher and preacher? It is quite true, the products of his shop have vanished, but there was something taking shape in that shop which did not vanish: his character.

Your choice about your future and final life's work may still be in the future; your best work may not yet have been begun. But the way you do what you have to do, today, will help set the pattern for every choice and every work in your life.

Friendships

NEXT after Jesus' life-work came his choice of friends. No doubt he had known Simon and the others before, and Mark simply records in his abrupt way the climax of a long story, in telling how Jesus "called" them.

We cannot imagine Jesus without his disciples. It is not exaggeration to say that even the Son of God would have been a failure, as a man, had he won no friends. There would have been no Christian religion if Jesus had had no friends.

Around New Year's time it is well to ask oneself the question: Am I as careful in selecting my friends as Jesus was in selecting his?

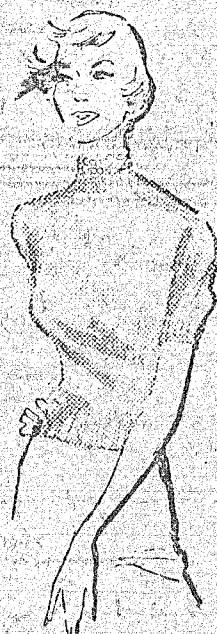
