

Lesson for December 24, 1950

SCRIPTURE: Luke 2:1-20; Philippians 8:4-7.
DEVOTIONAL READING: Matthew 2: \$-15.

THIS is a true story but it also is a parable for Christmas.

Once upon a time there lived a lady who had everything. As Christ-

mas time came on, her many friends racked their brains **to think what they** could give her. It would have been absurd to send her a check, for though she was not rich she did not really need money. There

There was not much use in giving her something like candy because she was on a diet and could not eat fancy foods. A Lovable Person
