lege of Surgeons, which sent out this data this week.
Only sixty hospitals in Texas rated this high, being o the totally approved status, although a few others are on the provisionaly approved since they have met minimun hequire a hospital or hospitals wholly approved and Santa Alina is probaidy the smallest town histed in the entire group,
while many larger towns with hospitals are left completely off the list.

All hospital patients have benefited by this movement, since improvements made to assure better care of surgical cases before, uuring, and atter operations have necessarily extended to all departments on the hospical sis overy service orrected and all patients whatever their ailments may be are better cared for because of it.

Surgeons grant that no matter how great the skill of the operator, deficient after care may convert a successsful covery than should have been attained. Hospitals have therefore heen eager to cooperate with surgical groups in nd attitudes. The extent of their cooperation is shown by he fact that whereas twenty years ago, when the American College of Surgeons made its first survey of hospitals in the United States and Canada, only 89, or 12.9 per cent, of the
692 hospitals surveyed, merited approval. All the hospitals in this first survey had 100 beds or more. This year the 25 beds or more, 2.821 or 73.3 per cent are meeting the renuirements for approval. of the 1,787 hospitals having 100 beds or
