He and his wife, Linda, have five children.

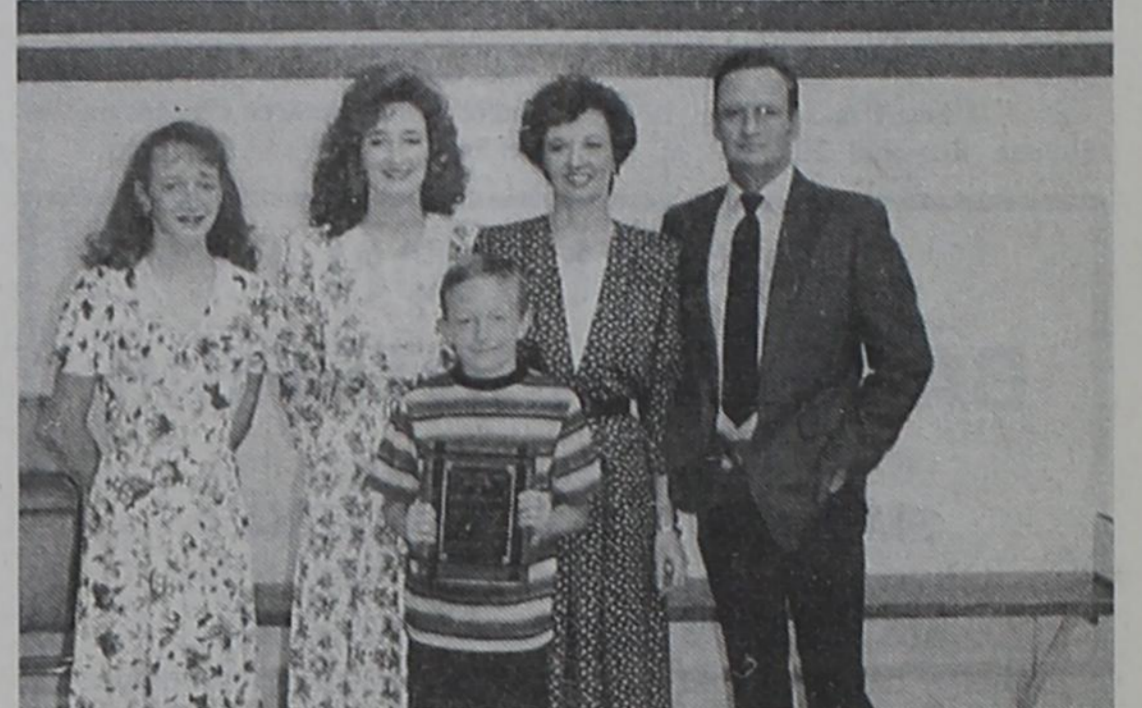

picking up 1 RBI; Nic Guthery had a double in this game.

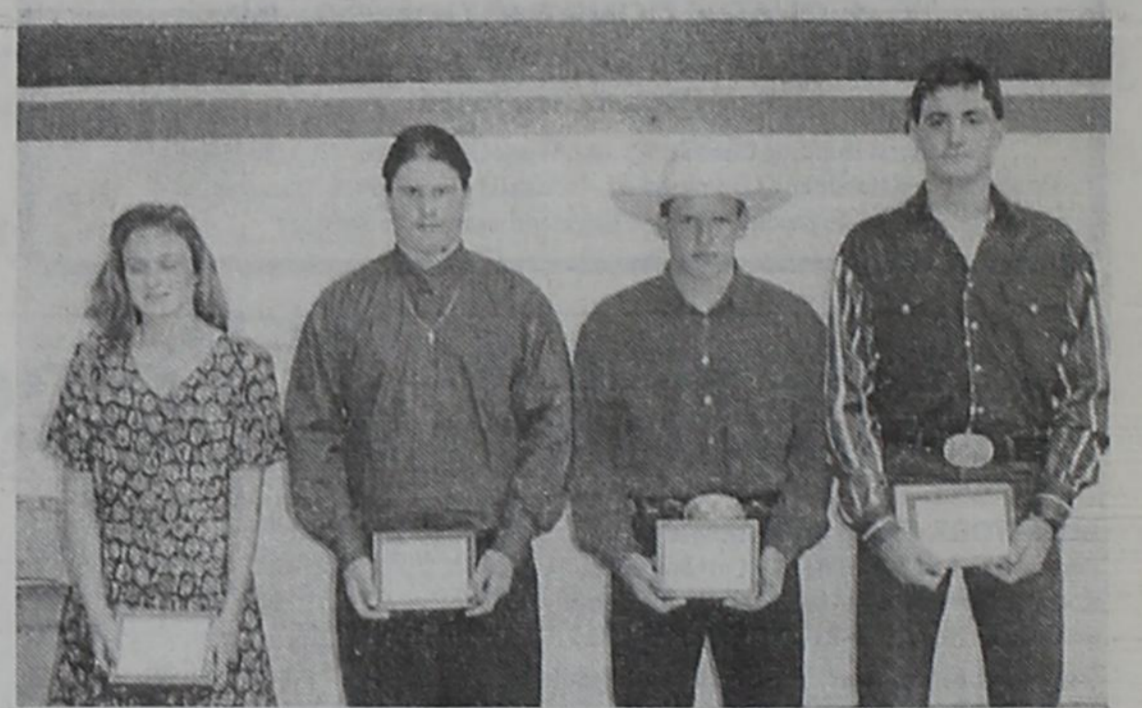
"I like the way our offense is working, but our defense has to improve. We are making way too many errors," said Coach Pettit. "If we're going to be successful we have to make the routine plays."

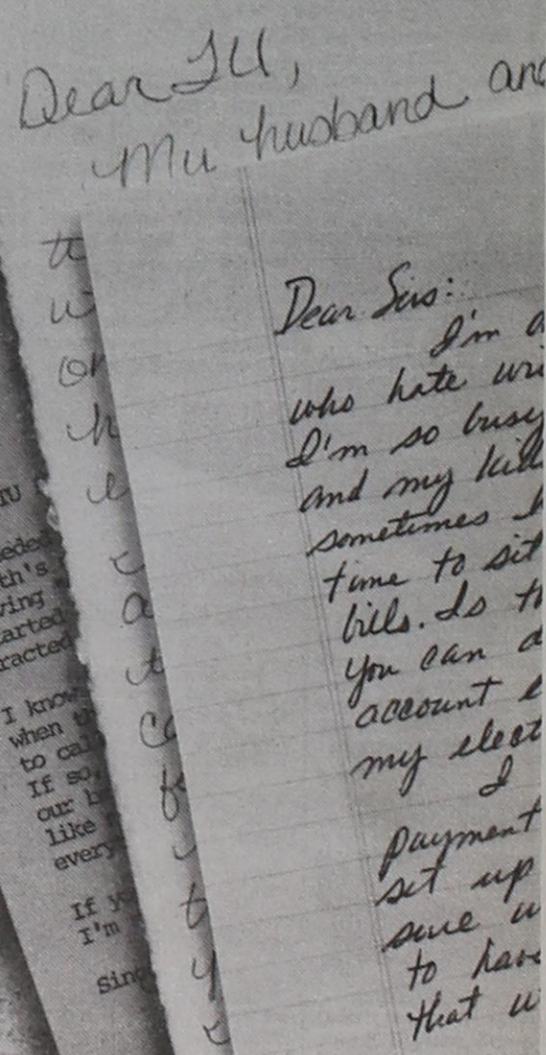
