

He made the switch to computer only five years ago, but has been working in the steel engineering field in the Ft. Worth area since

In 1981 when he was cured of colon cancer, Bob realized GOD had something for him to do but didn't know what. To figure that out took him another ten years. In 1991, Bob realized he was being called to ministry and started on the road to becoming a local pastor in the UMC.

# Peanut Turn Row" Tour Slated June 19

The Comanche County Extension Field Crops Committee has planned a Peanut "Turn Row" Tour for Thursday, June 19. The "Turn Row" Tour will assemble at the Beattie Community Center in Beattie on FM 588 for registration at 9:00 a.m. and will leave at approximately 9:30 a.m. The tour includes a sponsored noon lunch at Downing and two continuing education credits for private, non-commercial and commercial applicators. To preregister contact the Texas Agricultural Extension Service office in Comanche at (915) 356-2539.

The Peanut "Turn Row" Tour will focus on early weed, disease, thrip and nematode problems that are already affecting peanuts. This year is shaping up for tremendous weed pressure as a result of the spring rains. The tour will focus on new products and existing postemerge products that are doing a good job at week control. Tomato Spotted Wilt will be discussed including resistant varieties, insect control and things to do throughout the season. Tour speakers will include Dr. Chip Lee, Extension Plant Pathologist, Dr. Robert Lemon, Extension Agronomist and Dr. Chris Sansone, Extension Entomologist. This tour is designed to help answer questions about problems in early peanuts.
