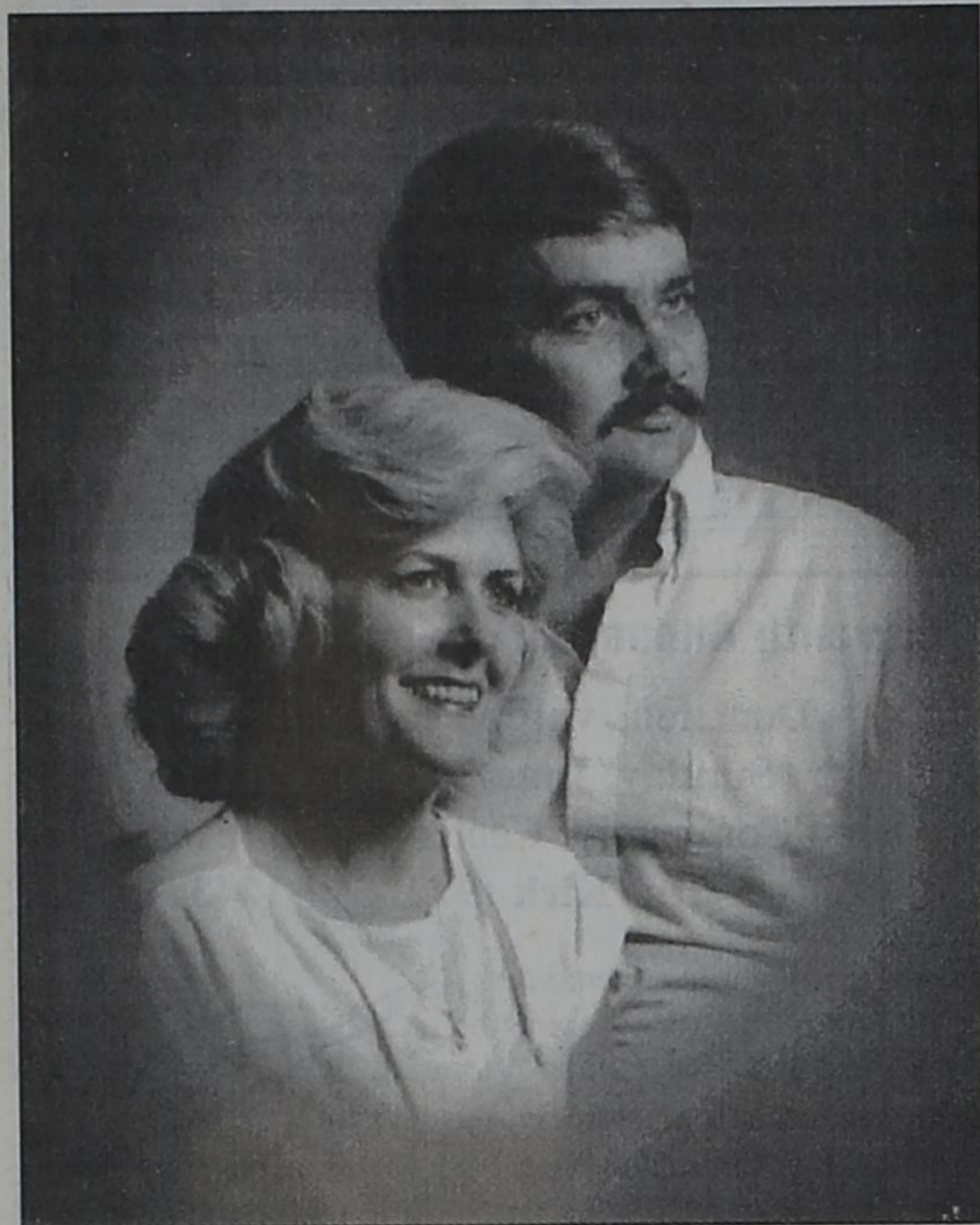


New Local Pastor For The First United Methodist

The Peanut "Turn Row" Tour will focus on early weed, disease, thrip and nematode problems that are already affecting peanuts. This year is shaping up for tremendous weed pressure as a result of the spring rains. The tour will focus on new products and existing postemerge products that are doing a good job at weed control.
