J. V. Girls Win 1st District Game


The J.V. Girls won their first district game here last Friday night. They won 32 to 15 over Lipan's J.V.



Change of Address

If you're a Social Security beneficiary and you moved recently, be sure to notify the Social Security Administration (SSA) as soon as possible. Failure to report their new address when they move is the most frequent reason beneficiaries do not receive their Social Security checks.

If your benefits are directly deposited into your bank account, you may not have remembered to notify SSA when you moved. But Social Security needs your current address so you can receive agency notices about your benefits. And now you're approaching the time of year when it's particularly important that SSA has your correct address. For example, in January you will be mailed a Social Security Benefit Statement (Form SSA-1099). You need this form to determine whether or not you will have to pay federal income tax on any Social Security benefits you received in 1996.

To report an address change, contact you local office or call SSA's toll-Tree number, 1-600-772 1215, t 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. any business day.




