

4-H Junior Leaders Enjoy District 8 4-H Leadership Congress

Take a Part — And they were glad to. Yes, 127 4-H Junior Leaders and County Extension Agents took a part in the District 8 4-H Leadership Development Congress at Tarleton State College June 13, 14, and 15th., 1966, following and carrying out the theme, "Take A Part? — I'll Be Glad To."

The leaders were broken into involvement groups of assembly banquet, group living, relaxation, recap, recreation, and agents. In these groups the junior leaders actually did the planning and execution of these plans for the Congress. Through this experience, these 4-H members learned to do by doing.

The group was welcomed to the campus of Tarleton State College by Dean Paul Cunyus, Dean of Instruction, Mr. Robert T. "Sonny" Davis, President of the Texas Leadership Institute, Inc., and Dr. Bardin Nelson, Texas A & M University Sociologist, spoke in general assemblies. Mr. Davis, a well known leader throughout the state, who has spoken to youth groups in Eastland, spoke to the group on the "6 Steps To Greatness for 4-H," giving the concepts and the principles.

One of the stops was London, in which Eva Thompson, Ranger 4-H member, and also a delegate to the Congress, was responsible for the decorations and directions for the games - "London Hats". Miss Thompson led the six different groups in this game as a part of the jet trip.

Robert Harbin, Eastland 4-H Club member, served as a member of the group living committee. This committee kept the members of the Congress aware of certain college rules which had

to be followed as we were visiting a college campus; in charge of the registration and reception; the flag ceremony; how the group was expected to dress for different occasions and places. Robert took an active part as a member of this group and had a part in the flag raising ceremony. They also played another important part — responsible for refreshments at mid-morning and mid-afternoon.

Many learning experiences were taken advantage of, one was the banquet on Tuesday night. Sharon Harbin, Eastland 4-H member, served with this group. They planned, decorated for, and conducted the program for the banquet. Sharon had a part on the program, which was a mock Art Linkletter program in which all were involved as well as those in the audience.

Yes, all who attended the Leadership Congress answered the challenge in the theme, "Take a Part? — I'll Be Glad To". They left the Congress after the noon meal Wednesday anxious to return to their own counties and waiting for someone to say, "Would you take a part?" They are anxious to put to use the information and experience which they received so they may develop better leadership in themselves as well as in others. A challenge to you is, give these youth the opportunity to Take A Part.

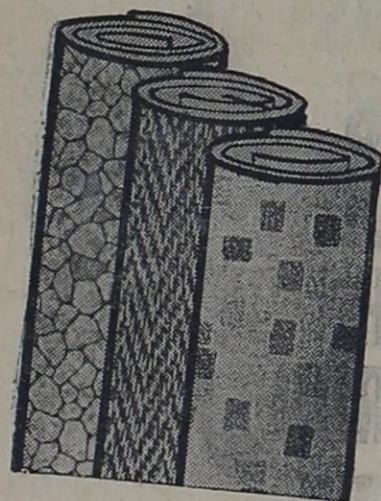
