The 91st District Court is a court with general jurisdiction. This means that criminal, civil, family, and juvenile cases are heard in the 91st District Court.

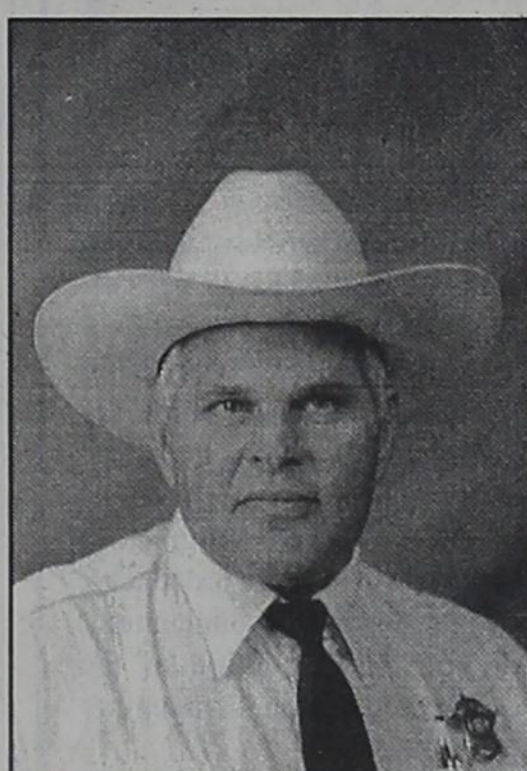

The Gorman Panthers had a double loss on Friday night when they hosted the Millsap Bulldogs. First, they lost a hard fought game 26 to 15, and secondly they lost a very outstanding player, Shannon Mauney for the season with a broken leg below the knee. Both bones were broken.

The Friday-the-13th night was really a bad one as following the injury to Mauney, one of the Millsap cheerleaders was injured in a fall while doing a pyramid routine. She was carried to the De Leon Hospital and later transferred to Cook Children's Hospital in Fort Worth with unknown injuries.

Millsap hit the scoreboard on their first possession as they took the ball on their own 49 and scored in 10 plays with Lucas Mitchell running for the final 10 yards for the touchdown with 6:21 left in the period. The kick for point failed and Millsap led 6-0.

Then on their next possession after an interception on the Gorman 26 yard line the Bulldogs scored in just 2 plays. Following an 11 yard run, Mitchell hit the end zone on a 15 yard run with 3:12 left in the first period. The run for points failed and Millsap was up 12-0.

The Panthers came back on their next possession, taking the ball on their own 26 and scoring in just four plays. The first play netted 0. Then Reese Clark got 12 yards on a keeper play to the 38. After a 2 yard loss, Clark handed off to Jeremy Bryan who raced for 64 yards and a touchdown on a beautiful run with 1:29 left in the period. Kris Carlton booted the extra point and the score was 12-7.

But on the next possession the Bulldog offense showed their power as they took the ball on their own 26 and scored in just 3 plays, with Michael Gentry catching a pass and racing 75 yards for the score with 11:48 left in the second. Matt Snow then ran in for the 2 points and Millsap led 20-7.

The Bulldogs scored again before the halftime getting the ball on the Gorman 38 and scoring in four plays. Following a pass for 12 and an 11 yard

run Mitchell scored again from 15 yards out with 8:17 left in the period. The run for point failed and Millsap led 26 to 7.

Gorman hit the scoreboard with 5:12 left in the half when they took the ball on their own 41 and scored in 6 plays. Following a 1 yard run, Margarito Sanchez broke loose on a beautiful 25 yard run for a first down on the Millsap 33. Following a no gain run, Sanchez raced 17 yards for a first down on the 17. Then after a 1 yard loss Jeremy Bryan broke through the line and raced 18 yards for the score with 5:12 left in the half. The kick try was blocked by the Bulldogs, but rolled into the end zone and was covered by Gorman for 2 points to make the score 26-15.

The teams played scoreless ball in the second half with the Big Red de-

fense holding the Bulldogs to only 1 first down the second half while racking up 10 first downs. However, the Panther offense failed to score in the second half.

Bryan led the Panthers with 147 yards on 16 carries. Sanchez had 87 on 18 carries. Reece Clark had 22 on 7 keepers. Adan Rodriguez had a -3 on 4 tries and Leslie Wood had a -2 on one carry.

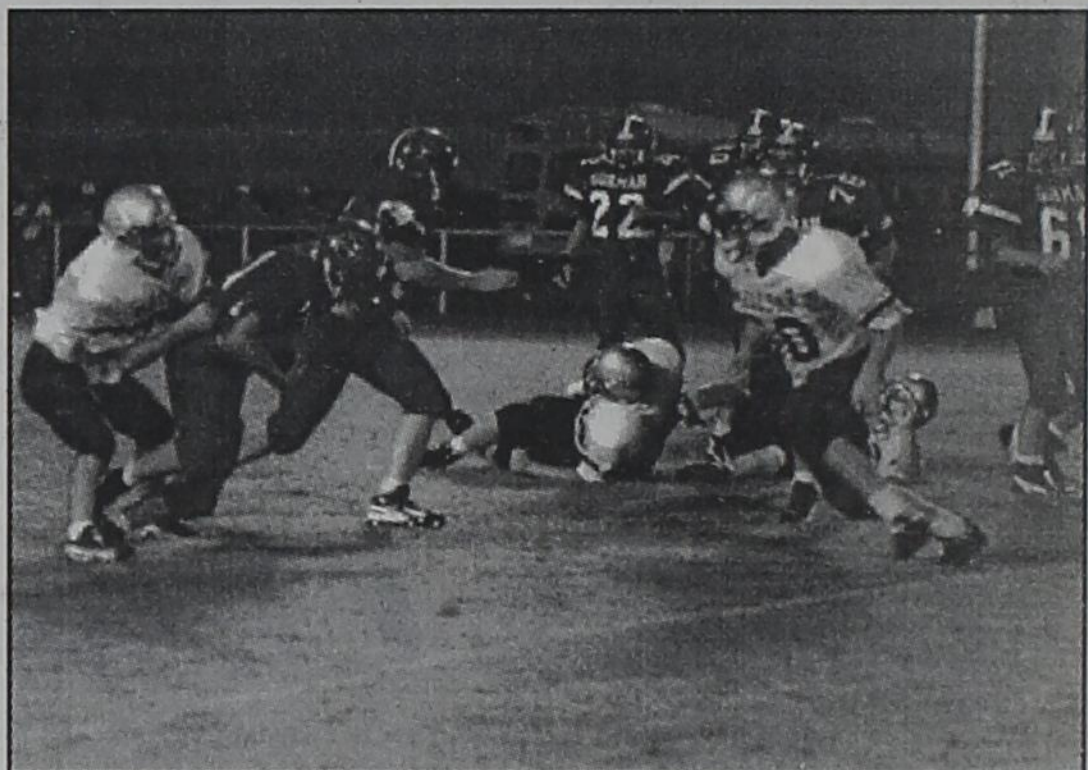
