

Recent rains certainty improved he agricultural situation in East-and County. It now looks as if we will have hay to bale soon. If county livestock producers give special attention to harvesting tood-quality hay at the ringt time, hey will find out that this means extra dollars when the hay is fed lext season.

Delaying harvest of hay will result in an increased tonnage, most ly in the form of stalk and fiber, but overall quality will be low

Johnsongrass, sudan hybrids, and other grasses which produce seedheads should be cut before the seedheads emerge. Crops such as Coastal Bermudagrass should be cut when the growth is about four weeks old or less. Plan to cut affalfa when it's one-tenth to one-fourth in bloom

Cutting hay at these stages gives the highest production of total digestible nutrients (TDN).

Another important point to re-nember in producing high quality ay is to start baling as soon as ossible after cuttings. A hay conthe drying process.

The month of July offers gar-deners an ideal time to prepare for the coming hot, dry weather and to take advantage of some prac-

Hot dry weather can be extremely critical for some plants in the garden. Supplemental watering is recommended for plants such as hydrangea, coleus, caladium, general coleus, caladium, caladium,

Container plants and hanging baskets also require extra water and fertilizer during hot weather. Gardeners should apply fertilized to dry soil.

Newly planted trees and shrubs, face their most critical time in plant growth during the first sum-mer. They may have trouble get-ting established because of their

Instead of giving the plants frequent light watering, give them at thorough soaking to a depth of about eight to 12 inches. The soilt should be allowed to become dry in the upper two inches before watering again. Mulch over the root area will also help conserve moisture.
