The following household size and income citeria will be used for determining eligibility． Children from households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for ree or reduced price meals．
Application forms are being sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians．To
apply for free or reduced price meals，households should fill out the application and return it to the school．Additional copies are available at the principal＇s office in each school The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by school or other pro－ gram officials
For the school officials to determine eligibility，the household must provide the follow
ing information listed on the application：Names of all household members；social security ing information listed on the application：Names of all household members；social security numbers of all adult household members or a statement that the household member doe they currently receive food stamps；and the signature of an adult household member certi－ ying that the information provided is correct．
Applications may be submitted at any time during the year
Ull will reveiw applications and determine eligibility．Parents or guardians dissatisfied with basis．Parents wishing to make a formal appeal may make a request either orally or in writing to（name，address，phone of the hearing official）for a hearing on the decision． Households are required to report increases in household income of over $\$ 50$ per month or $\$ 600$ per year and decreases in household size．Also，if a household member become nemployed or if the household size increases，the household should contact the schoo for free meals if the household＇s income falls at or below levels shown above．
