# Panthers Drop Evant 47-27; Go To Cross Plains

The Panthers hit the "W" column in a big way on Friday night when they dropped the Evant Elks 47-27 at Brogdon Field on Parents Night. This was the first win for the Big Red this season and put them at 1-0 in District 8-A.

Gorman hit the scoreboard on their second possession after taking the ball on their own 21 and scoring in 7 plays. Margarito Sanchez got the final 45 yards on a beautiful pass from Reece Clark with 4:28 left in the first period. Kris Carlton booted the point after and Gorman led 7-0.

Then on the following hick off Jesse Jones caught the kick on his own 20 and raced through the Big Red defense for an 80 yard return with 4:11 left. Kevin Smith kicked the point after to knot the score at 7-7.

On the next possession the Panthers started a drive on their own 23 and went the distance in 7 plays with Sanchez going in from 7 yards out with 2:04 left in the first. The drive featured runs of 7 and 21 by Sanchez for first downs, an 18 yarder by Cisco Madera and a 15 yard pass to Adan Rodriguez to set up the score. Carlton kicked the point after and Gorman led 14-7.

Gorman hit the scoreboard again with 8:19 left in the second period when Jeremy Bryan got the score from 1 yard out to cap a 57 yard drive. The drive featured runs of 14 and 29 by Sanchez for first downs and a 11 yarder by Bryan. Carlton added the point after and Gorman led 21-7. This was the halftime score.

The Panther Marching Band put on a very good halftime performance that was very pleasing to the fans.

After the halftime break the Big Red Defense stopped the Elks and forced a punt. The Panthers took the ball on their own 17 and went the distance in 11 plays with Sanchez getting the final 4 yards with 5:32 left in the third. The drive featured a run of 17 by Sanchez, runs of 10 and 15 by Bryan for first downs and another 7 yarder for a first down at the Evant 4. Carlton booted the point after and the score was 28-7.

Then on the next possession by the Elks, the drive started at the Evant 37 and covered 63 yards in 6 plays with Chuck Beach getting the final 9 yards with 3:32 left in the third. Keith Martin ran for the 2 pointer and the score was 28-15.

After the Panthers failed to move on their next possession the Elks took the ball on the Gorman 49 and scored in 7 plays with Martin getting the final 5 with 10:42 left in the final period. The kick for point failed and the Elks moved to within 28-21.

But the Panthers came right back on their next possession going 66 yards in 7 plays with Sanchez racing in for the score from 22 yards out with 7:46 left. The drive featured a 9 yard pass to Sanchez, a 12 yard run by Sanchez, and a 12 yard run by Madera. The point after kick failed and Gorman led 34-21.

After holding the Elks on their next possession the Panthers got the ball on their own 30 following an interception and scored in just one big burst up the middle by Bryan for 70 yards with 6:40 left. The try for 2 points failed and the score went to 40-21.

On their next possession the Elks took the ball on their own 21 and scored in 3 plays with Jesse Jones catching a 73 yard pass from Martin with 4:56 left. The kick for point failed and the score was 40-27.

The Panthers then took the kick on their own 33 and went the distance in 7 plays with Sanchez getting the final 7 yards with 2:14 left. The drive featured runs of 29 and 9 by Bryan and 11 and 12 yarders by Sanchez. Carlton added the point after and Gorman had a 47 to 27 victory.

Sanchez led the Panthers with 193 yards on 26 carries. Jeremy Bryan had 173 on 22 tries. Madera ran for 30 on 2 carries. Adan Rodriguez had 5 yards on 1 try and Reece Clark had 7 yards on 4 keepers.

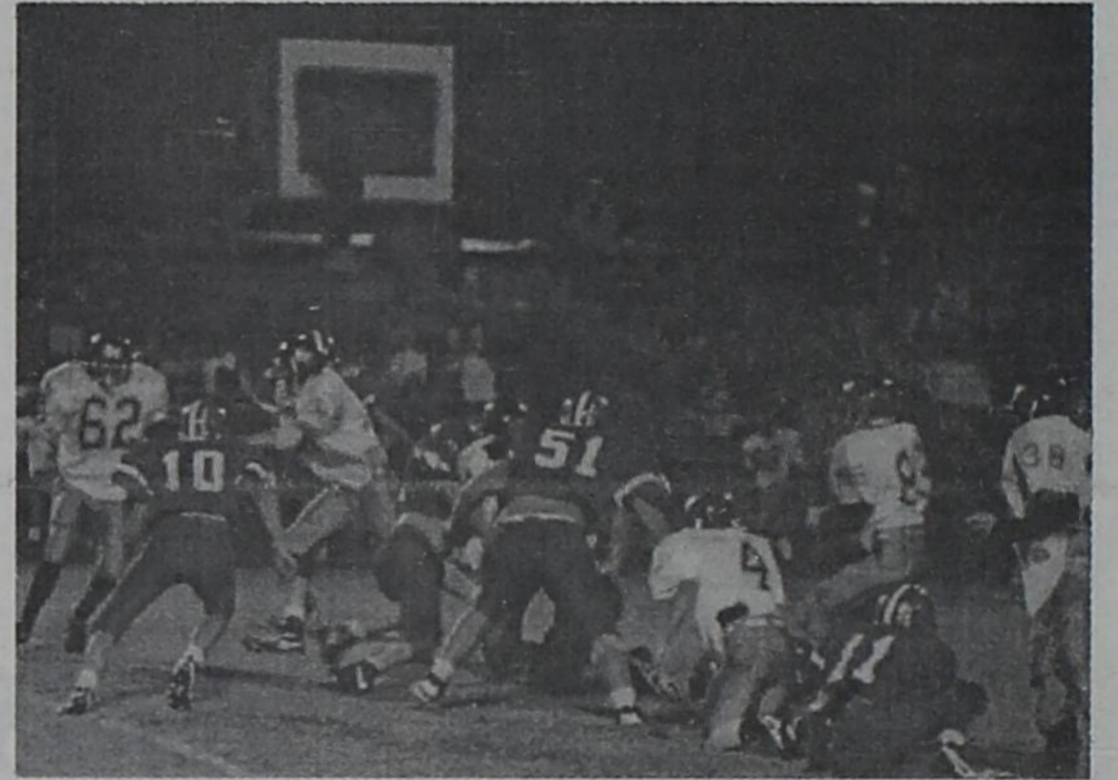

## USWCD Election Slated

An election of a soil and water conservation district director to serve in Zone 4 of the upper Leon Soil and Water Conservation District is scheduled for October 15th announced Norman Moore, Chairman of the Board. The election will be held at 7:00 p.m. in Rising Star at the Activities Building of the First Baptist Church.

Zone 4 of the District is basically the western one-half of Eastland County. However, all landowners and their spouses living within the District are eligible to vote. The Upper Leon District covers all of Eastland and Comanche counties and the western one-third of Erath county.

The purpose of the Soil and Water Conservation District is to promote sound soil and water conservation programs on farm and ranch lands. All conservation programs managed by the District are of a voluntary nature to the landowner or operator and are offered on a nondiscriminatory basis without regards to race, color, national origin, age, sex, religion, marital status or handicap.

Current directors of the Upper Leon Board are George Steel, Rising Star; Leo Williams, Desdemona; J.W. Sadberry, DeLeon; Larry Gibson, Dublin; and Norman Moore of Sidney, Chairman.

He has been a House member since 1991. He is a member of the House Appropriations Committee and is vice-chair of the Juvenile Justice and Family Issues Committee. He served two terms on the House Energy Resources Committee.
