"In Eastland County alone, 20 of the county's 65 bridges on city or county roads are consid red either structurally deficient or functionally obsolete. I commend the Texa Department of Transportation for considering an innovative approach to correc Currently, the local officials must
ridge located off the state highways fystem 10 percent of the cost to upgrade bridge located off the state highway system on a city or county road. The De-
partment is considering waiving that requirement if local officials will use that money to improve other bridges.
Statewide, 7,200 bridges on city and county roads are considered deficient
The public has 30 days to comment on the Department of Transportation proposal, which was tentatively approved May 25 by the Texas Transportation
