

District one includes the following counties: Coryell, Hamilton, Comanche, Brown, Mills, San Saba, McCulloch, Llano, Lampasas, Mason, Gilespie and Runnels.

State-at-large includes all the peanut producing counties in the State of Texas.

The applications must be received by April 22, 1996 to have the name placed on the ballot.

The election will be held by mail ballot. Ballots must be mailed to the polling place at P.O. Box 398, Gorman, Texas 76454 and postmarked by May 22, 1996.

Any person qualified to vote who does not receive a ballot 15 days prior to the election may obtain one at one of the county extension offices in a peanut producing county.




