The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Agricultural Marketing Sertvice (AMS) announced today that it will conduct a Request for Referendum Dec. 8, 2008, through Jan : 2, 2009, among eligible producers and importers of hogs, pigs, pork, and pork products. This process will determine if
