## AG VIEW POINT

Looking Ahead - 2010 Pecan Management
Most of your hands are still cracked and sore from shelling pecans in the early winter months, and you probably do not want to even see a pecan tree until it warms up in March and April. I feel that it is never too early to start thinking about managing pecan trees for the 2010 harvest. So in this article I wanted to hit some critical needs for the pecarr crop to be successful this year.

The first issue that comes to mind when I think about pecan trees is fertilization. This is very important for young trees. Nitrogen is necessary for rapid tree growth and is the only soil-applied nutrient that most pecan trees ever need. It is important to apply nitrogen in frequent small amounts during the first few years. Spread fertilizer on the soil surface, under the tree, but well away from the trunk. Nitrogen fertilizers are very soluble and are readily moved into the soil by watering. It is inefficient and unnecessary to make holes around the tree to pour the ertilizer into the ground. Ammonium sulfate ( $21-0-0$ ) and ammonium nitrate ( $33-0-0$ ) are common, economical nitrogen fertilizers that can be used

F in late May or early June. Apply fertilizer plication in late May or early June. Apply the fertilizer broadcast on the surface starting 3 to 5 feet from the trunk and extending out a few feet past the free canopy. Water the fertilizer into the Frequ. Avoid scattering fertilizer on sidewalks or paved driveways because some materials can cause unsightly, although seldom permanent, spotting
Frequent anches. During the first 7 years, trees grow best if foliar sprays of zinc are applied at least every 2 weeks throughout the growing season of April through severe cases, dieback ees are not growing, reduce the spray frequency. Spray mature trees with zinc at least three times between bud break in late March or early April and early June. Zinc is needed primarily by young expanding leaflets. Leaflet expansion on mature trees usually stops by mid-June. Two of several choices of zinc materials to spray are:
Zinc nitrate is formulated as a liquid. Use 2 to 4 teaspoons per gall or 1 to 2 quarts per 100 gallons of water.
Zinc sulfate is formulated as a powder. Use 2 teaspoons per gallon or 2 pounds per 100 gallons of water.
UAN liquid fertilizer ( $32-0-0$ ) can be added at a rate of 1 quart per 100 gallons of the zinc sulfate solution to improve penetration of zinc into the foliage. Zinc sulfate spray can cause leaf burn on other trees in the home landscape, especially peaches, plums and other stone fruits. Zinc sprays are most effective if applied early or late in the day with fittle or no wind. The higher humidity under these conditions allows longer wetting and more zinc absorption. Zinc sprays pose a minimal hazard to man and animals, yet care should be taken not to contact the spray directly. Zinc sprays are not likely to stain sidewalks, houses, cars, etc.

"It includes foods from all of the food groups on the United States Department of Agriculture's food guidance system, MyPyramid. The preparation is easy enough to allow your children to play an active role in helping prepare and serve this meal. If you have school age children, talk about the 5 color bands on MyPyramid and help them identify which color band each of the foods in this recipe would fit into. For older children and teenagers, consider talking with them about eating a variety of different foods from all of the color bands. Explaining why this recipe would benefit them personally is also important to older children and teens. For example, you could explain how eatr ing foods from the milk group, like the mozzarella cheese in this recipe, helps keep our bones strong, the vitamins from the spinach and tomato keep our skin looking healthy and the protein from the chicken is full of protein which is good for strong muscles. Most of all however, use the time you spend in the kitchen preparing meals to communicate with your children and enjoy your time as a family together! This recipe is a wonderful addition to your list of healthy family recipes and I hope that your family will enjoy it as much as mine does!"'
