Elected county committee members serve a three-year term and are responsible for making decisions on FSA disaster, conservation, commodity, and price suppses.

County committee members are a valuable asset because they are local producers who participate in FSA programs themselves and have a direct connection to farmers and ranchers in the community. We would like to see a high level of participation in this year's nomination and election process.

Producers may nominate themselves or others as can didates. Organizations that represent minority and women farmers and ranchers may also nominate candidates. Nominees mus
participate in a program administered by FSA, be eligible to vote participate in a program administered by FSA, be eligible to vote
in a county committee election and reside in the local administrative area (LAA) in which the person is a candidate. To become a nominee, eligible individuals must sign form FSA-669A. The orm and more information about county committee elections are available online at: www.fsa.usda.gov/elections.

It is important that the county committee reflects the individuals represent. We strongly encourage all producers, in cluding women, minority and beginning farmers and ranchers to participate in the nomination and election process.
County committees are comprised of three to five mem
bers elected by local producers. All newly elected county com mittee members and alternates will take office January 2, 2012. Nomination forms must be postmarked or received in
the local USDA Service Center by close of business on August 1 ,

This year's election will be held for LAA 3, which is
the southwestern portion of the county. LAA 3 has been serve by Brandon Geye for the past nine years. Because Mr. Geye ha reached his term limit, he won't be eligible for re-election.
