Order Prohibiting Certain Fireworks Issued

STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF EASTLAND

ORDER PROHIBITING CERTAIN FIREWORKS IN UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF EASTLAND CO., TX

WHEREAS, the Texas Forest Service has determined that drought conditions exist in Eastland County; and WHEREAS, on the 13th of June, 2011, The Commissioner's Court of Eastland County has determined that the normal danger of fire in the unincorporated areas of Eastland County is greatly enhanced by the extremely dry conditions now existing.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commissioner's Court of Eastland County adopts this order prohibiting the sale or use of restricted fireworks in the unincorporated areas of Eastland County.

A. No person may sell, detonate, ignite, or in any way use fireworks classified under 49 C.F.R. Part 173.100(r)(2) (10-1-86 edition), as "skyrockets with sticks" and "Missiles with fins" in any portion of the unincorporated area of Eastland County.

B. This Order Does Not Prohibit:

1. Common fireworks, small in size classified as Class C explosives;
2. Large fireworks devices designed primarily to produce visible or audible effects by combustion, deflagration, or detonation and classified as Class B explosive by the U. S. Dept. of Trans. [Tex. Occ. Code, Chapter 2154].;
3. The use of restricted fireworks at La Mancha Ranch on Lake or at the point area of Lake Cisco.

C. A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or intentionally violates a Prohibition established by this Order. An offense under this Order is a Class C Misdemeanor.

Important Rule Changes For 2012 Eastland Co. Stock Show

The ECLRA Board of Directors have made some revisions to the 2012 Livestock Show Rules and Regulations. The Board believes these adjustments will improve the quality of competition at the county stock show and allow new opportunities for exhibitors. The following list is a sampling of the rule changes.

- Market hogs must weigh at least 200 pounds and no more than 270 pounds. ECLRA will continue allowing a 3 pound tolerance on both ends of the weight range.
- Market steers must weigh at least 900 pounds and will be divided into classes strictly by weight. There will be no breed classes.
- Exhibitors will be allowed to enter and exhibit up to four market lambs, so long as at least one entry is a hair sheep.
- Breeding Beef Heifers must present registration papers showing ownership by the exhibitor effective on or before December 1, to show in breed classes. Non-registered heifers must show as All Other Breeds.
- Exhibitors may only compete for showmanship honors in divisions in which they owned and exhibited an animal.
- Commercial heifers may show as individual entries or in pens of three. All commercial heifers must be 24 months of age or younger at the time of the show.

All exhibitors and their parents or guardians are responsible for knowing and understanding the rules. Additional rules were amended clarifying eligibility of students. Students may obtain a copy of the 2012 rules from the county agent or their local agriscience teacher.

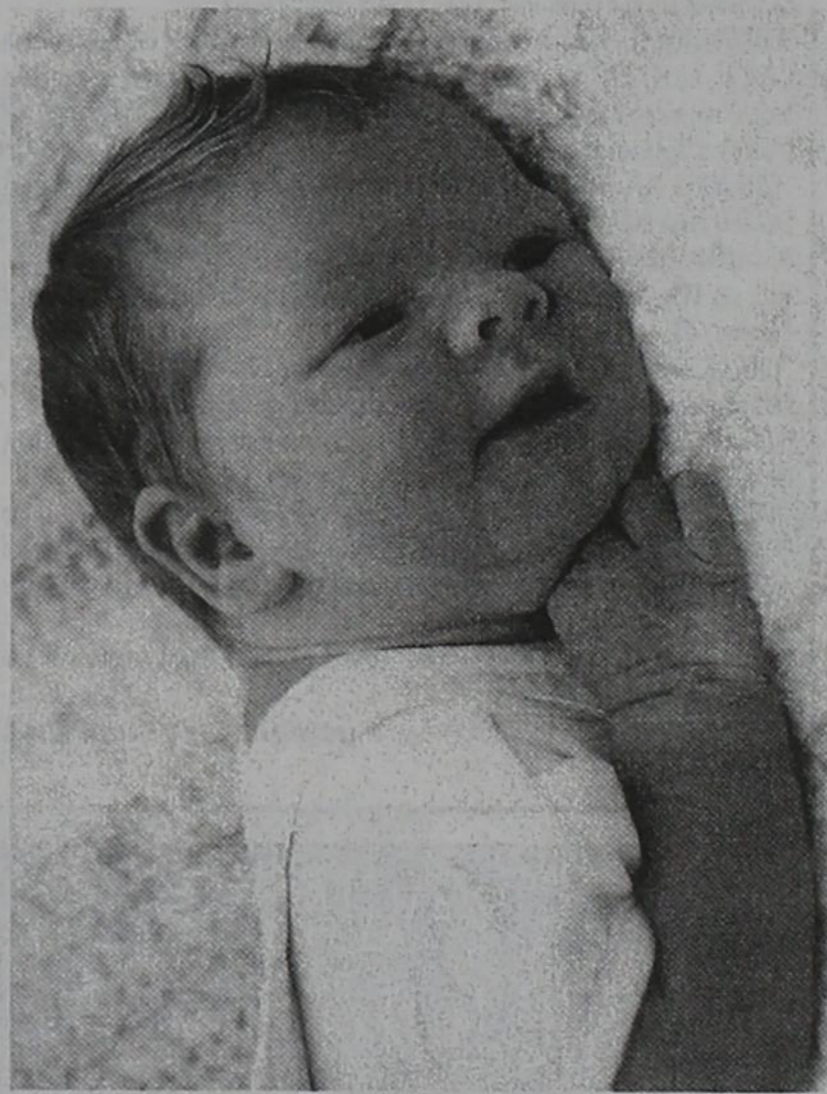

A Letter To The Editor

About Education and the Afghan War

President Obama is trying to keep a promise to bring US troops home from Afghanistan in July, but it is not easy to keep promises made when you are trying to get elected. Secretary Gates is advising him to just bring the support troops home and leave the fighting men there because the Afghans won't stop fighting when we come home.

It was ten years ago when we invaded Afghanistan in response to 9/11/01 attack. We blamed the attack on Osama bin Laden because he had training camps in Afghanistan.

Now we've killed bin Laden in his hideaway in Pakistan but there are training camps all over the world and we are farther from winning the war in Afghanistan than when we started. We have spent 19 billion dollars, lost over 1,600 American lives, military, civilian contractors and journalists, and killed ten times that many Afghans. To justify our action we point to Iraq where we've had over 5,000 killed, 33,000 wounded, while we killed over a million of the enemy.

What have we accomplished? More children go to school in Afghanistan now than before the war. Isn't that great? We have to cut funds to education in the US, fire teachers, cut supplies and services and buildings for education while we educate Afghans who are already smarter than we are. Witness their ability to defeat the world's most powerful military machine with roadside bombs and suicide attacks.

Some Afghan women can also leave their faces uncovered and Afghans can listen to modern American music. Both of these privileges are questionable but mainly we spent the 19 billion dollars to kill Afghan fighters and to line the pockets of Hamid Karzai who is confident that given 3 billion more in American money which we are short on, he can run the country better than we can, if only we would quit killing the wrong people there - like women and children huddling together in their homes, the ones still left standing.

My advice to President Obama is to bring the troops, all of them, home and assign them to jobs fighting wildfires and flooding rivers in the good ol' US of A. It is not a mark of heroism to be killed by the children we educated in Afghanistan.

Emergency Farm Loan Applications Being Accepted At Farm Service Agency

Applications for emergency farm loans for losses caused by Wildfires that occurred from February 23, 2011 and continuing are being accepted at the Farm Service Agency (FSA) office located in Anson, Texas, Richard G. Young said today.

Callahan, Eastland, Jones, Shackelford and Stephens Counties are five of 119 counties in Texas recently named eligible for loans to cover part of production losses resulting from the Wildfires that occurred on February 23, 2011 and continuing. Richard G. Young, said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 100% of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue the agricultural business, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest rate is 3.75 percent.

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan", Richard G. Young, said. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop Insurance program will have to consider proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

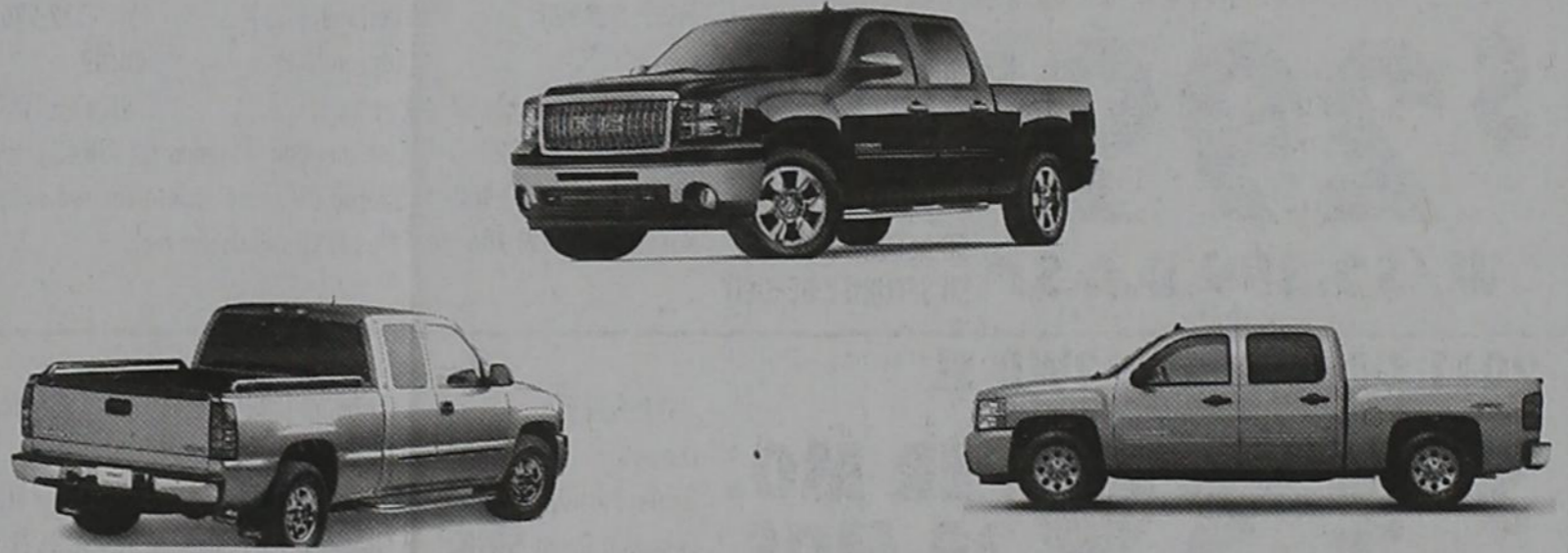
"Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be accepted until January 30, 2012, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing, with possible delays into the new farming season", Richard G. Young said.

FSA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and rely on farming for a substantial part of their living. Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who meet U.S. citizenship requirements and to farming partnerships, corporations, or cooperatives in which U.S. citizenship requirements are met by individuals holding a majority interest.

The FSA office in Anson, Texas is open from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday. Additional Information regarding Disaster Assistance Programs may be found online at <http://disaster.fsa.usda.gov>.

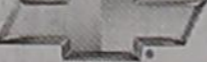

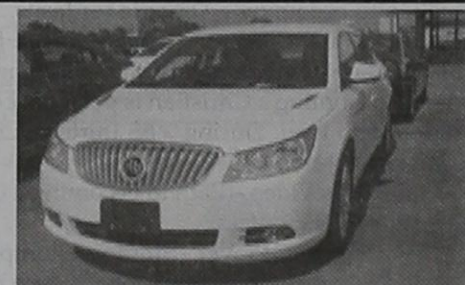
