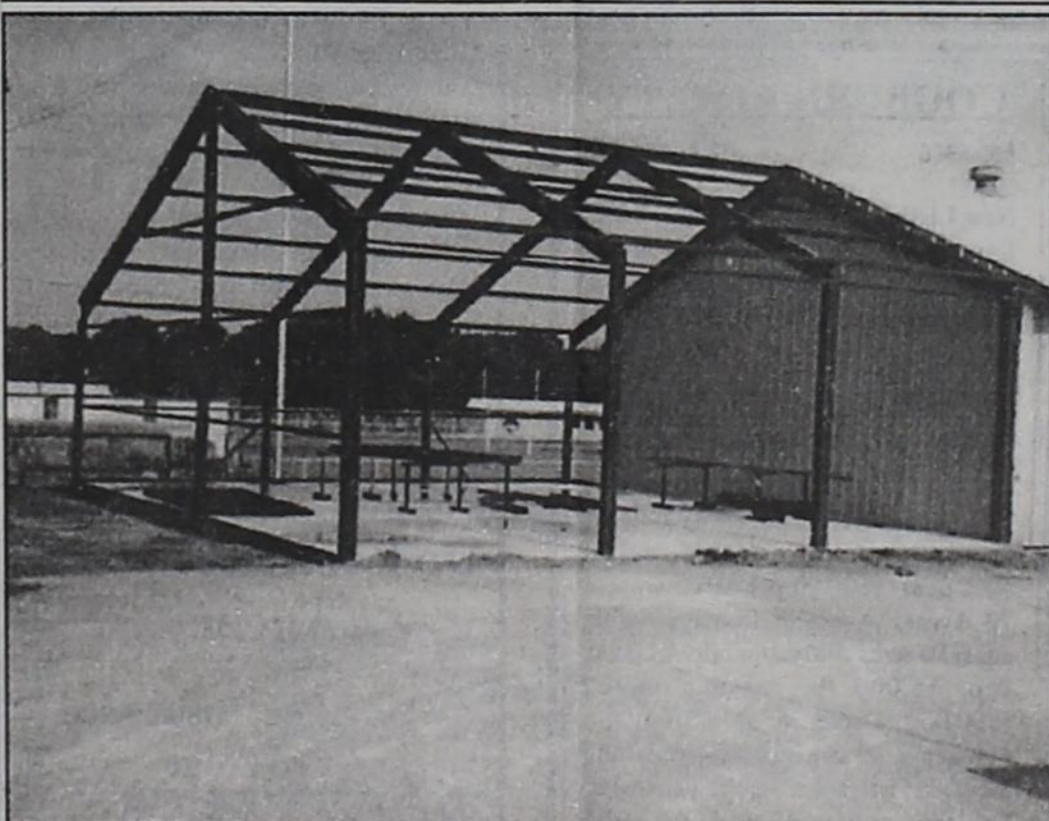

## Tommy Seay Wins State In Cowboy Poetry

Eastland County 4-Her Tommy Seay of the Olden 4-H Club talked his way into 1st place last Thursday, June 5th with his humorous Cowboy Poetry during the the 1997 Texas 4-H RoundUp at Texas A&M University in College Station. The Roundup attracts some 5,000 youth and adult leaders to A&M each June to compete for prizes and awards in 44 state contest including the Poetry Division of the Share-The-Fun Contest, the largest contest at State. Seay earned a standing ovation in the Hugh Rudder Tower theater, Thursday evening at the closing ceremonies of the '97 Roundup with his famous rendition of a Waddy Mitchell poem called "The Bra".



Seay had in previous years placed as high as second in that division, but according to Eastland County Extension Agent Davy Vestal, "Tommy could not have earned this award at a better time". Seay is a 1996-97 State 4-H Council Officer, one of 29 young people who represent 4-Hers on the State level. "Everybody knows Tommy because of his Council responsibilities and because of his duties it only highlighted the night even more", Vestal stated. Tommy is the son of Mr. and Thomas Seay and the grandson of Mrs. A. V. Seay, all of Gorman.

Hannah Hicks of the Nimrod 4-H Club participated in the Food Show at State Roundup. Nicks also was a recipient of a \$1,500 scholarship through the Texas 4-H Foundation, sponsored by Ag Workers Auto Insurance. Over 125 youth received upwards of 1.2 million dollars in scholarships at the State 4-H Roundup this year. This is the largest scholarship program in the world with funds coming from places such as The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, San Antonio Stock Show.

Nimrod 4-Hers Karl Winge, Billy Crozier, Miriam Nicks and Sam Curtis participated in the Wool Judging Contest placing 10th in the state's largest 4-H wool contest on record.

Rising Star 4-Hers Blair Bailey, Amy Agnew, Rachel Bush and Lacy Knight each competed in the Method Demonstration Divisions of the RoundUp.

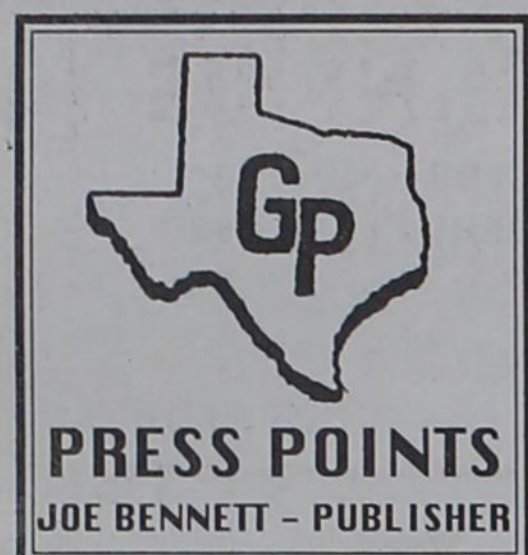

I was in the grocery store the other day and overheard a couple "discussing" the running tab on their groceries. The wife put a jug of milk in the shopping cart while her husband shook his head saying, "Can you believe the price on this?"

No telling what that same guy would have said had he been shopping in Tokyo where - on average - that same jug of milk sells for around \$6 a gallon. The fact is no one in the world pays less of their disposable income for food than Americans.

Sure there are some food items on every grocery aisle that will cost you a little more this year than last. But compared with the rest of the world, a trip to the supermarket in the U.S. is a downright bargain. Consumers in Japan would probably stock up on steak if they could pay \$4 a pound like we do in this country. Truth is they're paying \$26 a pound for that same sirloin.

In fact, of nine items normally found on our supper tables, shoppers in Paris pay close to \$30. Japanese residents pay almost \$60. While here in Texas and the U.S., that same supper will cost you \$16.91.

So before anybody starts fretting about the high cost of eating, we might want to stop every once in a while and think about that high quality, abundant food supply that American farmers and ranchers have allowed us all.

Just remember: it's hard to complain when your mouth is full.

### PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT

House Joint Resolution 4 proposes a constitutional amendment which would increase the school property tax residence homestead exemption from \$5,000 to \$15,000. The amendment would also authorize the Legislature to limit all or part of the exemption to political subdivisions that are the principal providers of elementary and secondary education within their boundaries.

In addition, the amendment would authorize the Legislature to allow the transfer of all or part of the age 65-and-over tax freeze to another homestead. Specifically, the Legislature would be authorized to provide that the current limitation against increasing school property taxes on the residence homesteads of persons age 65 or older, or their surviving spouse who is eligible to receive the exemption, may be transferred if the person establishes a different residence homestead.

The amendment would also allow the \$10,000 additional amount for the standard exemption to be used to lower the tax rate of persons cur-

rently receiving the 65-and-over tax freeze. Specifically, for a homestead affected by this limitation in 1996 or in an earlier tax year, the Legislature must provide for a reduction in the school property tax limitation in the 1997 tax year and subsequent tax years in an amount equal to \$10,000 multiplied by the 1997 school property tax rate.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment providing school property tax relief by increasing the residence homestead exemption by \$10,000 and providing for the transfer of the tax limitation to another qualified homestead for persons over 65 and a reduction in taxes subject to the limitation."
