



### New Flying Program Located At Waco

FTAF...FlyTAF...Flying Training Air Force.

Those names designate one of the nation's newest air commands, the administrative front office for the U. S. Air Force's rapidly expanding flying training program.

In operation since May 15, the new headquarters has jurisdiction over more than a score of bases dotting the nation from Florida to California and training all of the pilots, bombardiers, navigators, radar observers and combat crews for the Air Force.

The commander is Maj. Gen. Warren R. Carter, a veteran air officer who was training military pilots before many of today's Air Force officers were born and who has been almost constantly associated with the Flying Training program.

The Flying Training Air Force was created on recommendation of Lt. Gen. Robert W. Harper, commanding general of Air Training Command, when expansion of ATRC—which necessarily preceded expansion of other elements of the Air Force, became necessary.

Air Training Command reached the stage early in 1951 that its headquarters at Scott Air Force Base, Ill., was much too cramped to accommodate supervisory personnel required to administer a steadily increasing number of bases and other training facilities.

A component part of Air Training Command, FlyTAF was set up in downtown Waco, Texas, to take over reopened wartime bases, civilian schools which have been awarded training contracts and all phases of the flying training program.

FlyTAF conducts—or will conduct—basic pilot training at several of its bases, some of which are operated or will be operated by civilian contractors employing civilian instructors.

The USAF itself conducts this training at one base, Goodfellow at San Angelo, Texas. Civilian contractors are handling training for the Air Force at Greenville, Miss., Columbus, Miss., Spence AFB, Moultrie, Ga., Hondo, Texas, and Bartow, Fla.

The Air Force announced recently that Mauldin, Mo., Bainbridge, Ga., Marana, Ariz., and Kinston, N. C. will be in operation soon. All will be additional basic pilot schools.

flights, plus extensive ground school training.

Upon completion of basic flight training, aviation cadets enter advanced single or multi-engine pilot training now carried on at six bases. Single-engine flying is taught at Williams AFB, Chandler, Ariz.; Bryan AFB, Bryan, Texas; Craig AFB, Selma, Ala.; and Luke AFB, Phoenix, Ariz. At these bases students fly the F-51 Mustang or the F-80 Shooting Star. T-28's are used for transition.

An additional single engine jet base at Big Spring, Texas, will be activated soon. Construction of maintenance facilities is in progress now. A bombardier base during the war, it has served as the municipal airport since.

Subject to Congressional approval of appropriations, four new Texas bases will be added to the FlyTAF command. The sites under construction are at Harlingen, Del Rio, Laredo and Victoria. All will be advanced training bases.

Multi-engined advanced training is provided at Vance AFB, Enid, Okla., and Reese AFB, Lubbock, Texas, using the B-25 twin-engined Mitchell bomber.

The home of Air Force navigation training is at Ellington AFB, Houston, Texas, and Matheer AF B, Sacramento, Calif. is a post-graduate school to cross-train navigators and bombardiers in each other's skills and add radar observation to their talents. The T-29 Flying Classroom, the C-47 Skytrain, C-54 Skymaster and B-25 Mitchell are used at Ellington and Mather.

James Connally at Waco soon will join these two stations in the AOB (Aerial Observer bombardier) program. Missions of some other stations may be changed.

Also under FlyTAF are several bases with specialized flying training missions.

These include Nellis AFB, Las Vegas, Nev., where combat crew training is conducted for fighter pilots and aerial gunners, and Randolph AFB at San Antonio, Texas—the famous "West Point of the Air"—where combat crew training is given B-29 bomber crews.

Pilots and radar observers for the new two-placed Lockheed F-94 allweather fighter are trained at Tyndall AFB, Panama City, Fla., and Perrin AFB, Sherman, Texas; aircraft controllers in radar interception techniques are also schooled at these bases. The F-94 crews and aircraft controllers on the ground work together on perfecting air defense tactics in the final phases of their training.

The Air Force-wide instrument school also is located at Tyndall.

### WANTED BY FBI



HENRY WINSTON

The FBI has requested alert citizens and law enforcement agencies to assist in locating Henry Watson, National Organizational Secretary of the Communist Party, U.S.A., who has been convicted of conspiracy to advocate the violent overthrow of the government and who has gone in hiding to avoid being committed to prison. A description of Winston is as follows:

Age, 40, born April 2, 1911, at Hattiesburg, Mississippi; height, 5' 11 1/2"; weight, 200 pounds; eyes, brown; hair, black, kinky; complexion, dark; build, stocky; race, Negro; nationality, American; scars and marks, face pockmarked.

Winston resided in Kansas City, Missouri, prior to 1932, and worked at miscellaneous jobs in the Kansas City area. Since that time he has lived in New York City.

He likes baseball and other sports; dresses fairly well and does not speak with an accent. He has worked as a writer, organizer and lecturer.

Winston was convicted on October 14, 1949, for violation of the Smith Act and was sentenced to five years' imprisonment and \$10,000 fine. A warrant for his arrest was issued by the U. S. District Court, New York City, on July 2, 1951, when he failed to appear in the court for commitment to prison.

Any person having information which may assist in locating Winston is requested to immediately notify the nearest FBI office. The phone number appears on the first page of the telephone directory.

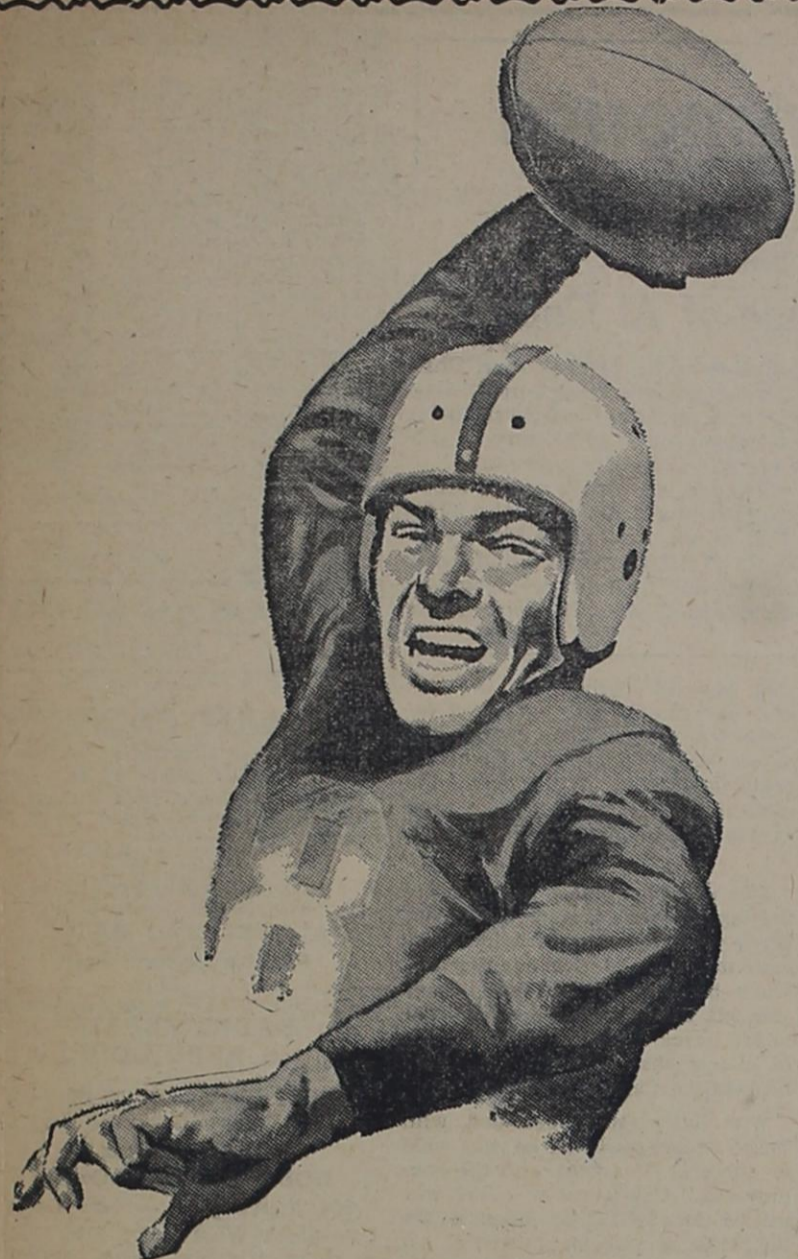

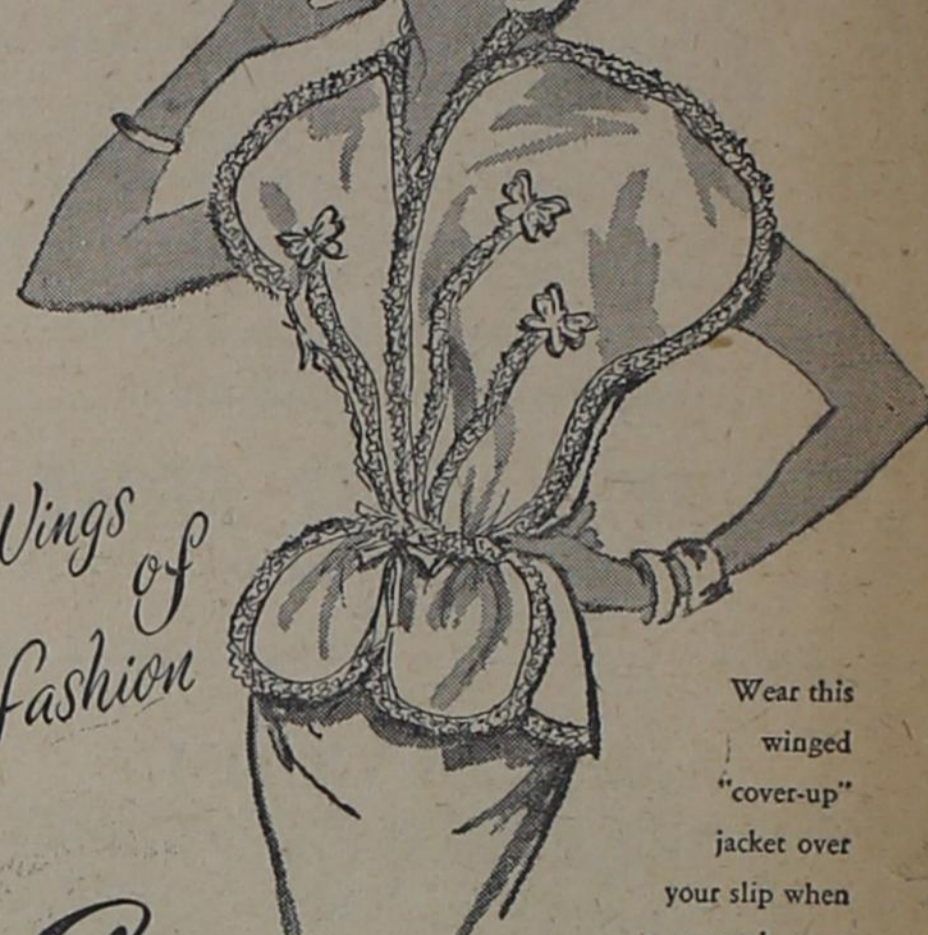

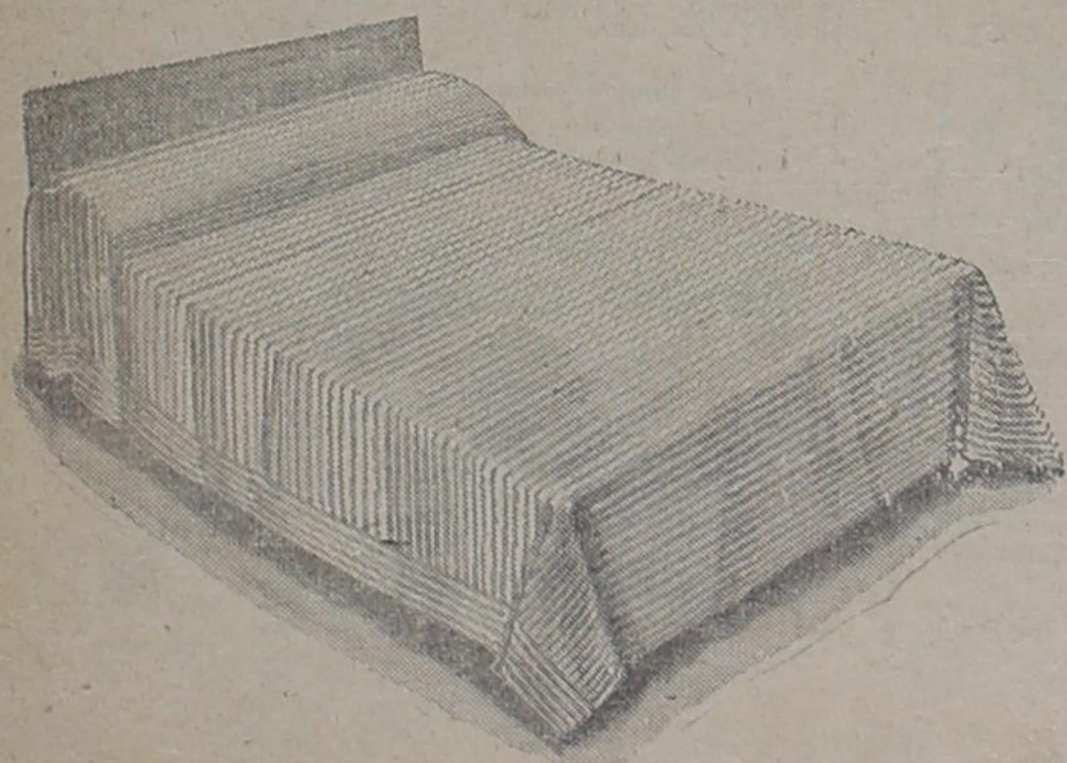
