College Founder Urges Citizens Consider Waste

GORMAN, EASTLAND COUNTY, TEXAS, THURSDAY, JUNE 5, 1952

Mr J F Hankins of Lubbock, a co-founder of the Hankins College operating in Gorman during the first decade of the century, presented an informative address naming as his subject The Nation al Resources Of Our State.

Mr Hankins gave a resume of facts and figures regarding the wealth of Texas in its natural resources, dealing especially with oil, gas and sulphur.

In the first portion of his address he stated that hundreds of thousands of cubic feet of gas were being waste, a goodly portion blown off into the air or burnt as a torch at the feilds. The gas companies in Texas he said had piped to and through many other states. The said states, he declared, getting cheap gas were each in turn adding a tax which made the net cost of gas in their state comparable with other fuels in order that the fuel corporations may be pro tected in their prices.

He also stated that the gas was being stored in some states against the time when wells of Texas run low. He proposed that Texas levy taxes on gas that would help graetly to solve the state's needed income. Mr Hankins estimated 2 cents on each bring 80 million dollars to the Texas Treasury.

He proposed a tax for raw sulphur, but noton refined because of the law prohibiting tax on ex ported manufactured articles.

The oil must be conserved but he did not advocate further tax since the oil tax is relatively high. Gasoline he stated was the last thing that should be taxed for in that we tax ourselves as no export tax can be levied on



A: It doesn't actually kill many swine but it takes a tremendous financial toll each year. Affected pounds. Also, swine flu victims are easier prey to cholera, enteritis and similar diseases.

Q: How does it act?

A: Hogs run a temperature, have a deep cough, tend to pile up, lose appetite, and become



Q: What causes swine flu? A: Both a germ and a virus, high-

Sudden changes of weather, poorly-ventilated or draughty quarters, and cold rainy spells seem to make hogs more susceptible. *

Q: If a flu outbreak starts, what should be done?

A: Have the trouble diagnosed immediately, so proper nursing and other treatment can be started. Move well pigs away from the sick ones.

Q: What about prevention? A: Keep swine away from old where flu infection is often picked up. Be sure hogs have

good shelter, with good bedding, proper light and ventilation. If new hogs are bought, isolate them for a week before allowing them to mix with the home herd.
