

The Agriculture Committees of the Congress are giving consideration to the decline in farm prices and those of us from the agricultural areas of the country have called upon Secretary of Ag riculture Benson to give the matter his immediate attention. The Secretary has had laid before him the proposition that the farmer can not purchase manufactured products, which includes a lot of very high priced farm machinery, unless he receives a decent price for what he raises.
