Because transportation was the great issue of the day, and because it was thought he should have a first hand working knowledge of labor problems, he remained in railroad work until the yards were moved from Hillsboro in 1911.


In 1911, Culberson was appoint ed deputy clerk of Hill County, a position he held until enlisting for the World War. The clerkship began an extended career in politics and public service.
