The article told of a Kaufman County veteran-farm trainee who planted 80 acres of row hegari, 8 pounds of Texas and Arizona hegari to the acre which produced approximately 1500 tons of silage. This farmer said that hegari planted thick in rows on good fertile land makes a rapid growth that smothers out noxious weeds and grasses. He reported that it produces a lot of roughage and grain for feed.
