In addition to all precautions taken in the home individuals con tribute enormous amounts of mon ey for the prevention and cure of disease both for themselves and for the community or country at large and yet some residents are breeding millions of mosquitoes, the insects which are known to

be disease carriers. Only a few weeks ago Gorman had no mosquitoes.

Unsanitary chicken houses, tur key roosts, rabbit hutches, filthy barns, open rain barrels, open cisterns are popular breeding places.

Possibly the surest method for checking the breeding is repeated spraying. However, the cleaning of places not exposed to the sun is almost a necessity and the bar rels and cisterns should be cov-
