

"They are still mean and they do not make good saddle horses. neither do they make work animals. So a rodeo outfit must continually add fresh stock to keep their lineup in top form," he said.

Cowboys gather the new bucking horses on the Lighting C Ranch near Dublin. Sleek and fat from rest at the headquarters ranch, these outlaw horses are ready to test the mettle of top cowhands gathered at the rodeo.

In keeping with his practice of adding new and tested bucking horses to his rodeo string, Colborn recently attended a bucking horse auction in Miles City, Montana where he watched hundreds of the top bucking horse prospects of the Northwest tried out.
