Third Grade Field Trip to Safety City
On February 3, the third grade classes and their teachers',' Mrs'. Caraway and Mrs. Spivey had a unique learning

Our young drivers drove their cars in the correct lanes on the multilaned roads, gave hand signals, watched and obeyed the traffic lights, stopped for pedestrians, and watched for bike riders also driving on the road. Each group had an opportunity to be bike riders, pedestrians, and car drivers.
