UPSIDEDOWN BOLOGNA SALAD

12 or 14 slices of bologna 1 pkg. (8 oz) shell macaroni cooked

1 4 lb. Cheddar cheese, cut into cubes

1 cup chopped celery 1 2 cup sliced pitted ripe olives 1 4 cup chopped green onions 2 tablespoons cut-up pimento 2 tablespoons minced parsley

3 4 cup mayonnaise 1 tablespoon vinegar 2 teaspoons prepared mustard

1 teaspoon salt 1|8 teaspoon pepper

Line a 1½ quart mixing bowl with 10 slices of bologna arranging slices to overlap each other and the bowl rim. Cut remaining bologna into thin strips. Combine with macaroni, cheese, celery, olives, pimento and parsley. Blend remaining ingredients; mix thoroughly with macaroni mixture. Spoon into bologna lined bowl, fold edges of meat slices over salad. Chill. Invert salad on platter and garnish with greens.
