The weathering of wood is brought about through the combined effects of rain, wind and light. 

#### Cake Batter

1 cup sifted all-purpose flour

1 1 2 teaspoons baking powder 1 4 teaspoon salt

1 cup sugar 1 4 cup water

1 teaspoon lemon extract

Make the topping first: Get a heavy 10-inch skillet, one that can be put in the oven, add butter or margarine and heat until melted. Stir in brown sugar and water smoothly and mix in both chopped and whole peanuts. Smooth over bottom of skillet evenly.

Now make the cake batter: Start your oven at 350 F or moderate. Sift flour, baking powder and salt together 3 times. Beat eggs slightly. Start adding sugar to eggs gradually and beat vigorously (use an electric or rotary beater) until mixture is very smooth and thick. Stir in flour mixture, a portion at a time, alternately with water and lemon extract. Pour over peanut topping and bake 30 to 35 minutes or until cake feels springy when touched. Loosen cake with a knife and invert over a serving platter. Delicious warm or cold.



You can deduct your state gaso-line tax. If you don't know how much gasoline you bought last year, divide the average number of miles your car gets per gallon into the total mileage for the year.

You can deduct driver license fees, and all interest charges paid on automobile loans during the

If you use your car exclusively for business purposes, you can deduct all operating and upkeep expenses. If you use the car for both business and pleasure, only the business part of the operating cost is deductible.

Although state gasoline taxes are deductible, Federal taxes are not. When you figure tax deductions, remember that the Federal tax on gasoline is now 4 cents a





Hamby said that membership in a cattleman's association also offered considerable protection for the individual cattleman. "In the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association, we not only have men who help apprehend the thieves, but also have an attorney who is available at all times to help local prosecutors in working up the theft cases. The Association also leases signs which serve as warning to any thief," Hamby said, "and most of the thieves I have talked with said that they try to skirt those ranches which have these signs posted."
