

Cy Cypher - Blake Guthery Named On All-State Teams





Burn victims improving

GORMAN - Two burn victims who were injured Dec. 1 during an electrical accident at Gorman Milling Co. are improving.

Jerry Ragland, who was received burns to his face and upper body, has been removed from the Burns Intensive Care Unit at Parkland Memorial Hospital in Dallas and placed in the hospital's Acute Care Unit. His condition has been upgraded from "serious" to "fair."

Bob Fritts was less seriously burned on his face and the lower left arm and was released from Parkland Dec. 3, but is still being treated for arm burns, including traveling to Parkland once weekly for treatment, said his father Harold Fritts, the owner of Gorman

the burns to his son's face had completely healed. Raglund received visitors Sun-

day, including Harold Fritts. "He can speak now, and he was alert and seemed to enjoy the conversation," Fritts said. "He's up walking some, too. Everything is looking up for Jerry, though I know

it will be a long process." Monday, a consultant with Safety Management Consultants of Mesquite, which was hired by Gorman Milling Co. to investigate the accident, said the company was not at

"All the precautions were there. There was nothing more they could have done," said Ross Beedle, a board certified forensic examiner.

Beedle said he consulted with electrical engineers during his investigation.

He said the accident occurred as the men were trying to reset an electrical switch box.

Electricity arced between power sources, producing a very hot flash, but not an explosion, Beedle said.

"It is like getting an intense sunburn, and of course, these men were very close to the sun.". Beedle added that the exact

cause leading to the arcing could not be determined, but he suspected a faulty electrical box or a power Gorman Milling Co., which

processes livestock feed and employs more than 50, returned to operating at full capacity six days after the accident, Harold Fritts

Ron lost his battle with cancer Friday, December 11th.


