Floydene Gilbert, who taught in the Rotan Schools last year, is enrolled in Abilene Christian College to begin work toward her masters degree.

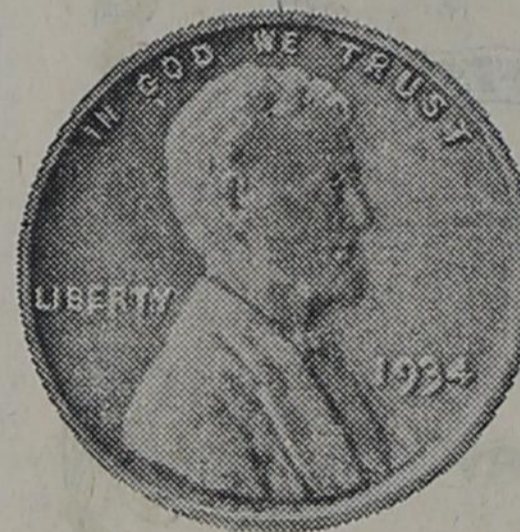
Carolyn Gilbert, a senior at ACC, has returned for the summer semester.

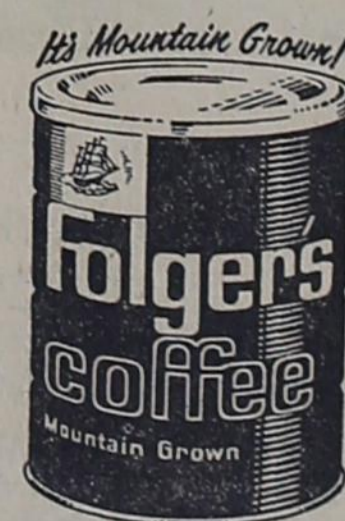
