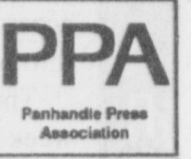

## Springlake-Earth grounds Eagles

### ■ Three Way eliminated in bi-district playoffs 53-39

WHITEFACE—While his team struggled to climb out of a nine-point halftime hole, Shawn Harrison was thinking about energy conservation.

He wasn't trying to save the world. The Three Way coach was just hoping his team wouldn't run out of gas.

But by the end of the game, Three Way was running on fumes as Springlake-Earth pulled away from the Eagles late in the fourth quarter for a 53-39 win in a Region I-1A bi-district game Thursday at Robert E. Smotherman Gymnasium.

"We got behind and had to work so hard to get within three, that we didn't have much left at the end," Harrison said. "We just weren't able to get over the hump. I was hoping that we could take the lead so we could pull the ball out, run some time off the clock, and relax a little."

Oscar Castillo keyed a game-breaking 7-0 run that stretched a three-point Wolverine lead to 45-35 with a little more than two minutes to go.

Castillo converted a three-point play, followed with a 15-foot jumper and completed

the spurt by assisting Russell Verden's fastbreak bucket.

Springlake-Earth, runnerup in District 7-1A, will play the winner of Friday's game between Miami and Silverton.

District 8-1A champion Three Way, which won its first district title since 1971, ends the season at 14-11.

Harrison, in his first year at Three Way, was far from disappointed after the loss.

"We won our first district championship in 26 years, we go to the playoffs and play respectable and had a chance to win it; we've got something to build on," Harrison said.

In the end, Three Way just couldn't match up with

## Council approves Henegar as new police chief

Rick Henegar was hired Thursday as the Muleshoe Police Chief on the promise that the department would become a more visible part of the community.

The Muleshoe City Council unanimously approved the hiring of the 36-year-old Henegar following an hour interview in executive session. Henegar also met individually with the councilors earlier in the day.

"I think the police department needs to become much more visible in the community," said Henegar, a 14-year veteran of Kermit Police Department. "I feel real good about being here. It's been my goal for a while to be a police chief."

Henegar will start March 10 at salary of \$33,500.

The city has been without a police chief since Julian Dominguez resigned in November of 1995. Jay Livingston has served in the interim.

"I feel like we made a good decision," Muleshoe City Manager James Fisher said. "I'm looking forward to him coming onboard."

"I know the public has been somewhat unhappy (about the current state of the police department) and have expressed their concerns,"

## Hospital Board wants to explore nursing home options

Officials at the Muleshoe Area Hospital District are attempting to peer into the future.

The District Board of Directors Thursday discussed a feasibility study for the possible expansion of the

Muleshoe Area Healthcare Center during their regular monthly meeting.

"We've known for a long period of time we need to look at the nursing home," district interim-administrator Jim Bone said in an interview. "It's really utilized by the

community." Bone said the feasibility study would look at options for the nursing home should it need to be expanded in the future. While there are no current plans, Bone said the future might call for expansion.

The nursing home currently

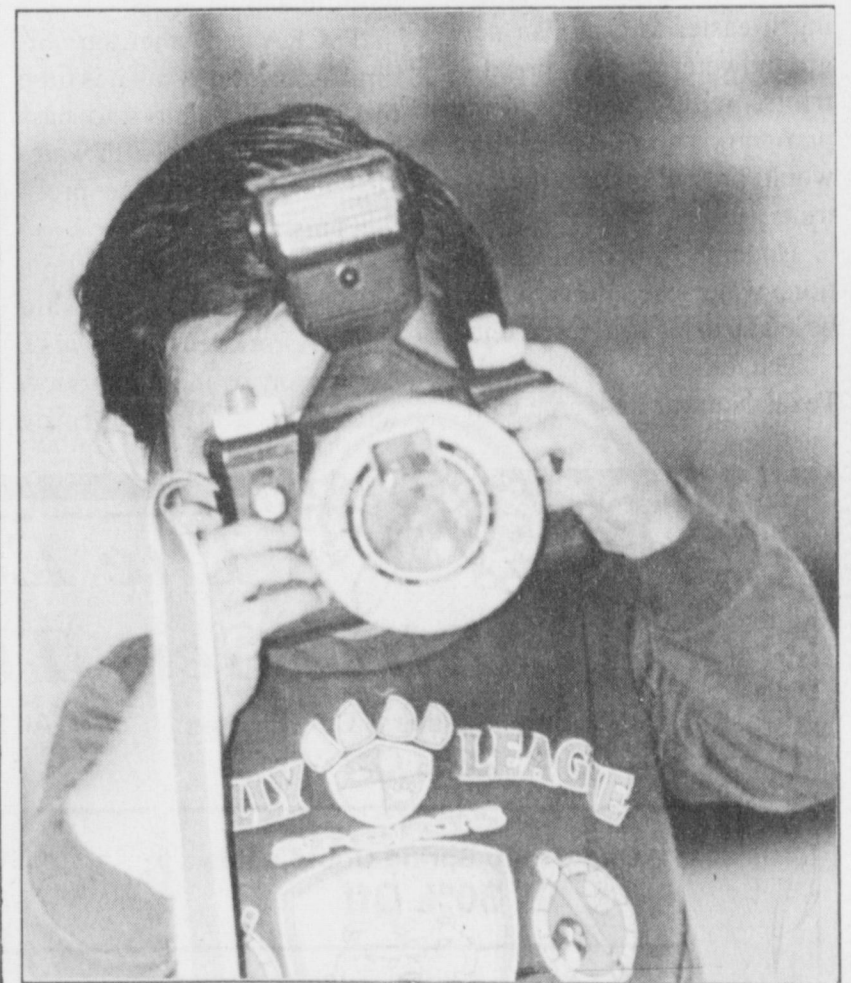
has space for 54 residents, according to manager Ed Dudley. The nursing home averages 52 patients on a regular basis.

Bone said grant money would be used to fund a feasibility study because the district does not have the money in the budget for such items.

In an effort to further educate the board about the different aspects of the hospital district, Bruce Hanchey presented an overview of the hospital lab. Hanchey, a lab technician at Muleshoe Area Medical Center, focused on the rules and regulations the lab must conform to in its daily operations.

"The world of lab testing is changing," Hanchey told board members as he discussed the Clinical Lab Improvement Amendment (CLIA), a 300-plus page manual designed to regulate medical labs. Hanchey said the lab constantly strives to keep up with changes in the CLIA as they happen.

Medicare also keeps the lab on its toes, according to Hanchey. For every Medicare-reimbursed test the lab performs, they must perform the same test on a "blind sample". The lab must maintain at least an 80 percent accuracy rate on their blind sample tests to receive Medicare funding.

## Highway 214 construction on schedule

Construction along Texas Highway 214 is on schedule, according to a Department of Transportation spokesperson.

Penny Mason, a public information officer with the DOT, said the \$4.2 million project should be completed in October. Construction is currently underway in small sections of the highway north and south of the Enochs area.

The project, which began in December 1995, is two-thirds complete, according to Mason. When finished, 14.5 miles of highway between Needmore and the Bailey-Cochran County line will be rebuilt and widened.

Heavy rains last summer caused some temporary delays in the project, and Mason said any severe weather could push back the completion date.

## Rain in area below average in 1996

After dry spring, in which some locations on the South Plains were up to 6 inches below normal in total rainfall, a wet summer helped relieve the drought.

However, slightly drier than normal conditions were experienced across the South Plains in 1996.

Precipitation totals varied considerably, ranging from 10.17 inches at Lamesa to 28.27 inches at Floydada.

The average annual precipitation across the South Plains is 19.30 inches.

The 1996 average was 16.67 inches, which is 86% of normal.

## TAAS testing next week at city schools

Muleshoe Independent School District will be administering the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills Test (TAAS) this week.

The exit level test will be administered to 10th grade students, as well as 11th and 12 graders needing to re-test in writing, reading, or mathematics.

In addition, students at the 4th and 8th grade

levels will be taking the writing test.

Testing will begin at each campus between 8:15 and 9 a.m. The writing TAAS will be administered Tuesday, the mathematics TAAS on Wednesday, and the reading TAAS Thursday.

## Subcommittee gathers input during ag credit hearing

Opposing voices surrounding the federal farm credit programs were given local attention in a field hearing called by U.S. Rep. Larry Combest.

The hearing, held Friday in Lubbock, addressed issues from direct and guaranteed loans to the preferred lender programs.

Joining Combest on the panel were U.S. Rep. Charles Stenholm (D-Stamford), and Rep. Mac Thornberry (R-Clarendon).

Combest, who serves as chairman of the House Agricultural Committee subcommittee on forestry, resource conservation and research, said that farmers survival may depend on the availability of credit.

"A stable farm credit infrastructure of USDA loan programs, commercial banks, and the Farm Credit System is critical to the future of many agricultural producers and to a dependable food supply," Combest said.

Several panels were assembled to speak at the hearing. The first panel, which consist of USDA representatives, spoke on the status of direct and guaranteed loans program portfolios, including outstanding principal and interest, delinquency rates, and loan losses.

A second panel, comprised of commercial bankers and representatives of the Farm Credit System, spoke about their participation in USDA's guaranteed loan programs, as well as their general views on agricultural credit.

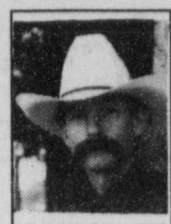
A third panel, composed of representatives from the Small Business Administration also spoke about SBA's guaranteed loan program and its recent improvements.

Public testimony was not permitted, although written comments can be submitted at the hearing or mailed to the U.S. House Subcommittee on Agriculture, Room 1300, Longworth building, Washington, D.C. 20515.

In other business, District Controller George Ann Walden presented the board with financial reports for January.

The district showed an operating income of nearly \$13,000 for January, with both the hospital and nursing home showing a positive bottom-line.

Due to lower admissions, charges from patients admitted to the hospital were down in January. However, outpatient

charges showed an increase.

Operating expenses for both the hospital and nursing home were lower in January, although utilities were up for both due to the cold weather.

The board also set dates for the upcoming election of seats 2 and 4 on the board.

Board president Tim Cambell and secretary Bob Finney will both be up for reelection May 3. They have both served on the board since the creation of the hospital district in 1989. Voting will take place in the Muleshoe High School Cafeteria.

Fisher said. "I want to thank them for being patient."

The resignation of former city manager Dave Marr in June further delayed process when the city council decided to let Fisher conduct his own search.

Henegar was one of two finalists interviewed by an eight-member search committee from an original applicant list of 25.

"The first thing I noticed was he was real energetic," said Cliff Black, one of two city councilors on the search committee. "Another thing that impressed me was that he really wanted to be involved in the community, especially with the kids."

"I also feel good about his law enforcement training and that he worked his way up through the ranks in the Kermit police department," Black added.

Henegar said he expected to make a lot of changes, although the only specific change he would discuss initially was a need for more patrols.

He said he would conduct a thorough evaluation of the five-member department before making any changes.

"He and I believe in a community-oriented and community-responsive police department," Fisher said.

Henegar and his wife Pam have two adult-age children.

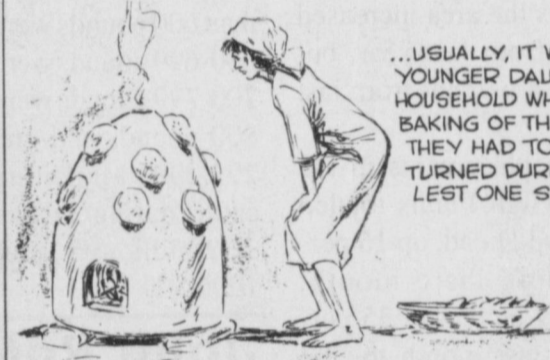

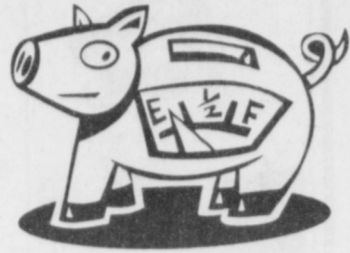
# Not filing is the worst choice

Don't let a shrinking wallet turn into a late federal income tax return. The results could make that wallet even emptier.

Once people get behind in their taxes, they often continue to put off filing. But the IRS says that is the worst move a person could make. Although there are penalties and interest for paying late, the penalties for failing to file in the first place are much larger. With each return not filed, the debt piles up. By the time IRS comes looking for the taxpayer, the amount owed may be overwhelming.

To avoid penalty and interest charges, people should pay their tax liability in full. Those

who cannot afford to pay what they owe should contact the IRS to discuss payment options such as installment payments and offers to settle their tax account for less than the amount owed. However, the offer must be in the best interest of both the person and the government.

The bottom line is that it's

always better to file and, if necessary, make arrangements to pay rather than waiting for IRS to enforce the tax laws. Consequences for not filing returns or answering IRS letters can range up to an IRS lien against property or, in worst cases, criminal charges.

The IRS has information on the rights taxpayers have when dealing with the IRS and the collection process, how it affects them, and where to get help if a problem can't be resolved. Details on these topics are covered in Publication 1, Your Rights As a Taxpayer.

A time of trouble is a time to pray. James tells us plainly, "Is any of you in trouble? He should pray" (5:13). Have you tried it? What happened?

Maybe the answer to your prayer was a wonderful, resounding, "Yes!" Remember the time you prayed for a dear

one in a life-threatening situation to live, and to the doctors' utter amazement, he did! Or remember the time you prayed for the troubled marriage of dear friends and watched in grateful awe as they got serious about making their marriage work? Maybe you prayed for an answer to what seemed like a "no-win" situation, and then God amazed you with just the right answer. Those are wonderful experiences for which we gratefully rejoice.

This column is not about those experiences. Those we can handle! Not nearly so wonderful are the times when we feel deep need, we pray, and the only answer is either an absolute refusal or, what may

be worse, deep silence. What about the time you prayed at your loved one's bed, and then he died? Or the time you prayed for your friends' marriage, but it only got worse? Or the time you prayed earnestly regarding a baffling problem, and it just remained baffling? What then?

Then we must learn the lesson of Gethsemane. Nothing was wrong with Jesus' faith when he prayed, "Father, if it be possible, remove this cup from me" But the cup of suffering was still pressed to his lips. You see, he had also prayed, "...not my will, but thine be done." Jesus' primary concern in his anguished prayer was not that he avoid a cross, though he wished he could; Jesus' main concern was to submit himself to God's will. Jesus' prayer did not change that will, but through it he found strength to walk even up Calvary's hill to the cross.

"Prayer changes things," the saying goes. Sometimes, in amazing ways, it does. But more often and in some ways maybe more amazing are the times God uses prayer to change the pray-er and grants the strength to walk in that will—even under the weight of a cross.
