SEEING the crowds, he went up on the mountain,
and when he sai down his disciples came to him he opened his mouth and taught them, saying "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
"Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted
"Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.
"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.
"Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.
"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.
"Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
"Blessed are you when men revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so men persecuted the prophets who were before you.
"You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown
"You are the light of men

to all in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven
"Think not that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets; I have come not to abolish them
but to fulfill them. For truly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, not an iota not a dot from the law until all is accomplished. Whoever then relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches men so, shall be called least in the king dom of heaven; but he who does them and teache For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pha enter the kingdom of heaven
"You have heard that it was said to the men of old 'You shall not kill, and whoover kills shall be liable to judgment.' But I say to you that every one who is angry with his brother shall be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother shall be liable to the council, and whoever says, 'You fooll' shall be liable to the hell of fire. So if you are offering your gift at the altar, and there remember that your
brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Make friends quickly with your accuser, while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison truly, I say to you, you "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you that every one who looks at a woman lustfully has already com mitted adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and throw it away; it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; it is better that you lose one of your
members than that your whole body go into hell. "It was also said, 'Whoever divorces his wife let him give her a certificate of divorce.' But I say to you that every one who divorces his wife, except on the ground of unchastity, makes her an adulteress; and whoc
"Again you have heard that it was said to the men of old, You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform to the Lord what you have sworn.' But I say to you, Do not swear at all, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. Let what you say be simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything more than this mes from evil.
"You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth'. But say so to you, Do not resist one who is evil. But if any one strikes you
on the right cheek, turn to him the othe als. on the right cheek, turn to him the other also; and if
any one would sue you and take your coat, let him any one would sue you and take your coat, let him have your cloak as well, and if any one forces you
to go one mile, go with him two miles. Give to him who begs from you, and do not refuse him who would borrow from you.
"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall ove your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say orsceute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven, for he makes shis sun rise on
he evil and on the good and sends he evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just
and on the unjust For if you love those wh low and on the unust. For if you love those who love
you, what reward have you? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? And if you salute only your brethren, what more are you doing than others? Do
not even the Gentiles do the same? You, therefore,
must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

"Thus, when you give alms, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by men. Truly, I say to you they have their reward. And in praying do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard for their many words. Do not be like them, for
your Father knows what you need before you ask him. Pray then like this:

> Our Father who art in heaven
> Hallowed be thy name.
> Thy kingdom come,
> Thy will be done.
> On earth as it is in heaven
> Give us this day our daily bread;
> And forgive us our debts.
> As we also have forgiven our debtors;
> And lead us not into temptation,
> But deliver us from evil.'

For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive yon!, but if you do no orgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father orgive your trespasses.
"And when you fast, do not look disinal, like he hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that ti:cii fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be een by men but by your Father who is in
secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.
"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves reasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and teal; for where your treasure is, there will your be also.
"The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your ye is sound, your whole body will be full of light; but if your eye is not sound, your whole body will fur or darkness. If then the light in you is dark No
will hate one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be God and mammon
"Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you shall eat or what you shall drink or about your body, what you shall put on. Is not e more than food, and the body more than cloth ng? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than hey? And which of you by being anxious can add one cubit to his span of life? And why be anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the ven, will he not much more clothe you, O men of ittle faith? Therefore do not be anxious, saying What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek all these hings; and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first his kingdom and his ighteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well.
"Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, or tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Let the day's trouble be sufficient for the day.
udge not, that you be not judged. For with the judgment you pronounce you will be judged, and the measure you give will be the measure you get. Beware of false prophets, who come to you in been's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves You will know them by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thorns, or figs from thistles? So, every sound tree bears good fruit, but the bad tree bears evil fruit. A sound tree cannot bear evil fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus you will know them by their fruits.
"Not every one who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophey in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name? And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you evil-doers.'
"Every one then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house upon the rock; and the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat upon that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. And every one who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house upon the sand; and the rain fell and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell; and great was the fall of it."

And when Jesus finished these sayings, the crowds were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as their scribes.
