Jesse Leach of Holdenville, Oklahoma was elected vice-president and B. D. Green of Gorman was re-elected as secretary-treasurer. The Association operates the peanut price support program for the U. S. Department of Agriculture in southwestern states. Last year the organization stored and supervised the disposition of some 12 million dollars worth of peanuts delivered to it by farmers. In addition, the association received and disposed of less than top quality, shelled peanuts from With Bridal Shower shellers valued at about 2 million dollars.

The new board president is long-time resident of the Gorman producer of peanuts for many years. He is currently serving as a member of Agriculture Secretary Freeman's National Peanut Advisory Committee and as member of the Peanut Administrative Committee - an 18-member national committee which administers the Peanut Marketing Agreement to carry out the peanut quality control program. Warren is irrigating 160 acres of peanuts on his farm north of Gorman and is producing an additional 140 acres under dryland conditions. In addition to peanuts, he also carries on a sizeable cattle operation using both native pasture and Coastal Bermuda in his beef production program.

flowing over the lid. As well as observing the rules of strict cleanliness of the eyes, the National Eye Research Foundation urges us to follow other relation to the eye. Avoid dangerous games with arrows and darts.
If you are employed where safety
goggles are used, don't take
chances—use them. Since eyes
give us no warning, as a rule, that something is wrong, it is a good idea to have them examined every six months.


