## Building Donated To Livestock Assn. By Lone Star Gas

The members of the Committee associated with the Livestock Raisers Association met in the Chamber of Commerce building on Friday, February 20 at 5 p. m.

The purpose of this meeting was to complete details and formulate final plans for the moving of a building that has been donated to the Eastland County Community Center. This building was donated by Lone Star Gas Co.

Lone Star valued this building at \$30,000. The size of this building in its original state was 31 feet by 113 feet 5 inches and will be moved to the new site and restored to the original size and state of repair.

This building will be located south of the present facilities that are used for the annual livestock show. It will greatly benefit the junior exhibitors of our county. The size of our show is growing yearly and we are fast growing out of our present facilities. Also, we will have additional space to accommodate open exhibitors. Originally our local ranchers could exhibit, but this had to be stopped because of limited space. In making space available for our ranchers we can have available for observation some of the excellent breeds of cattle that are being raised in our county.

The cost of moving this building will be about \$5,000. Over

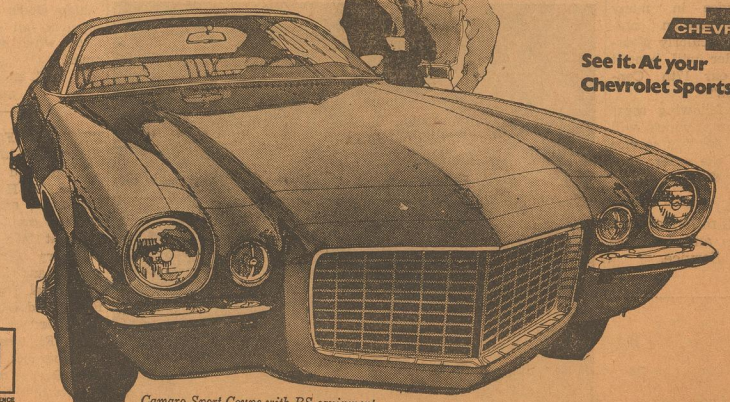
