Linda Rodgers To Leave On June 4 For European Trip

Linda Rodgers, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. D. V. Rodgers, will leave June 4 for a 20 day vacation abroad.

She will depart June 4 from Dallas Love Field by American Airlines jet flight to New York. From there she will take Air India's short overnight jet flight to Europe. Arriving in London June 5, she will be taking a connecting flight to Amsterdam, the "Venice of the North". A sightseeing tour by bus will be made with a visit to Ann Frank's House, the Rijksmuseum with Rembrants famous "Nightwatch," a diamond cutting factory, and a boat trip through the winding canals.

A bus trip across Holland will stop at Arnherim for a visit to the Open-Air Museum; continuing into Germany to Cologne for a visit to the great Gothic Cathedral, and on to Coblenz, a lovely city on the Rhine.

Linda will board the Rhine Steamer at Boppard for lunch and will disembark at Bachrach and will continue by bus to Heidelberg, Germany where she will have the opportunity to visit the Red Ox Inn, famous as the scene for the movie, "The Student Prince," and a picturesque country-side tour of Germany before departing for a tour of the Swiss Lake area in Switzerland and will stay overnight at the Hotel

Fronalp at Morschach, situated on Lake Lucerne at the foot of the Alps.

Other points of interest on the tour is a bus tour of Italy and the famed Gotthard Pass with lunch at the summit, and on to the Italian Lakes and an overnight stop in Milan. A morning sightseeing tour of the Cathedral and Chapel of Santa Maria della Grazie and to see de Vinci's "Last Supper" and the La Scala Poera House will be made before departing for a drive via Placenza and Bologna to Florence and an evening visit to Michelangelo's Plaza for a view of the city at night. At Florence, points of interest will be sightseeing of the treasure store of the Renaissance including the Pitti Palace, Michelangelo's "David" and other highlights of the city. From Florence she will journey to Rome through the Tuscan Hills to Assisi. A visit to the Basilica with its tomb of St. Francis.

From Rome the tour will continue to Pias and a visit to the Leaning Tower, and continue across the Bracco Pass to Rapallo and a continued spectacular coastal drive along the Italian and French Riviera, and arriving in Nice in time for dinner, most of the day here will be spent shopping, swimming and a visit to Monte Carlo for a visit to the Palace of Princess Grace. An overnight stop is planned at the Hotel Continental in Lyon. From there she will continue the scenic drive through the famous Cheateau country, location of the residents of the Kings and Queens.

In England, Paris, London and Startford are included in the tour. Linda will arrive back in Dallas on June 24.

PUBLIC NOTICE

TO THE RESIDENTS OF PROPOSED SOUTH EASTLAND COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT, ALL OF WHICH LIES WITHIN A PORTION OF EASTLAND AND COMANCHE COUNTIES, TEXAS, AND ALL OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS:

THIS GIVES NOTICE THAT, under the authority of Section 9, Article IX, Constitution of the State of Texas, a bill which authorizes the creation of South Eastland County Hospital District, the boundaries of which are co-extensive with and identical to the boundaries of Gorman Independent School District, so that all the area lying within Gorman Independent School District shall lie within South Eastland County Hospital District, all of which area lies within Eastland and Comanche Counties, Texas, will be submitted to the 59th Legislature of the State of Texas for its consideration.

This bill, if enacted by the Legislature, provides among other things that the district has the power to issue bonds to provide funds for the acquisition or construction, or both, of necessary buildings and equipment for hospital purposes and to levy taxes at a rate not to exceed 75 cents on the \$100 valuation of all taxable property in the district to support the bonds issued and the maintenance and operating expenses of the district.

HOWEVER, the bill requires the approval of a majority of the qualified property taxing electors of the district voting at an election called for that purpose; and the bill prohibits, after the creation of the district, all other municipalities or political subdivisions from the levy of taxes and the issuance of bonds and other obligations for hospital purposes or for providing medical care within the boundaries of the district.

Sen. Yarborough Puts Okay on Don

U.S. Sen. Ralph Yarborough, making public a declaration of his preference for Don Yarborough for governor by paying a personal visit to Yarborough's campaign headquarters Sunday morning, predicted D. Yarborough will win the runoff "going away."

The senior senator came down the steps of D. Yarborough's Austin headquarters carrying a Yarborough campaign sign, with a V for Victory signal, to declare: "We're on the verge of electing the first loyal Democratic governor since Jimmy Allred was governor 30 years ago. The people of Texas are entitled to elect a governor at least once every 30 years."

As the D. Yarborough staffers and supporters cheered, the senior senator continued: "Folks, you don't know how wonderful it's going to be. You're going to think flowers are blooming in January this year. I wouldn't be surprised to see strawberries ripening in January."

The senator said he had never led into a runoff in a gubernatorial race, and said in 1956 when he ran for governor he was 150,000 votes behind going in the runoff.

"In the runoff I was so close it took 'em two weeks to count me out of it," he recalled.

People Saturday night, Sen. Yarborough said, have been telling Don Yarborough that although they worked as county managers for Hill and Briscoe "we're putting our shoulders to the wheel Monday morning for Don Yarborough for governor."


The senator reasoned "all the shrewd campaigners are out of it now."

It appeared obvious the senator feels Yarborough will attract, among others, supporters of Hill and Briscoe.



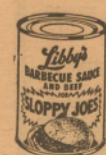
