

This bill, if enacted by the Leg-islature, provides among other things that the district has the power to issue bonds to provide funds for the acquisition or con-struction, or both, of necessary buildings and equipment for hos-pital purposes and to levy taxes at a rate not to exceed 75 cents on the \$100 valuation of all tax-able property in the district to support the bonds issued and the maintenance and operating exmaintenance and operating ex-penses of the district.

HOWEVER, the bill requires the approval of a majority of the qualified property taxpaying electors of the district voting at an election called for that purpose; and the bill prohibits, after the creation of the district, all other municipalities or political subdivisions from the levy of taxes and the issuance of bonds and other obligations for hospital purposes or for providing medical care within the boundaries of the

Garden chemicals are carefully screened by USDA and the Food and Drug Administration before manufacturoers are allowed to make them available to producers. The label clearly states the insects for which the insecticide is effective, its rate of application and the necessary waiting interval between application and eating or processing the vegetables.




