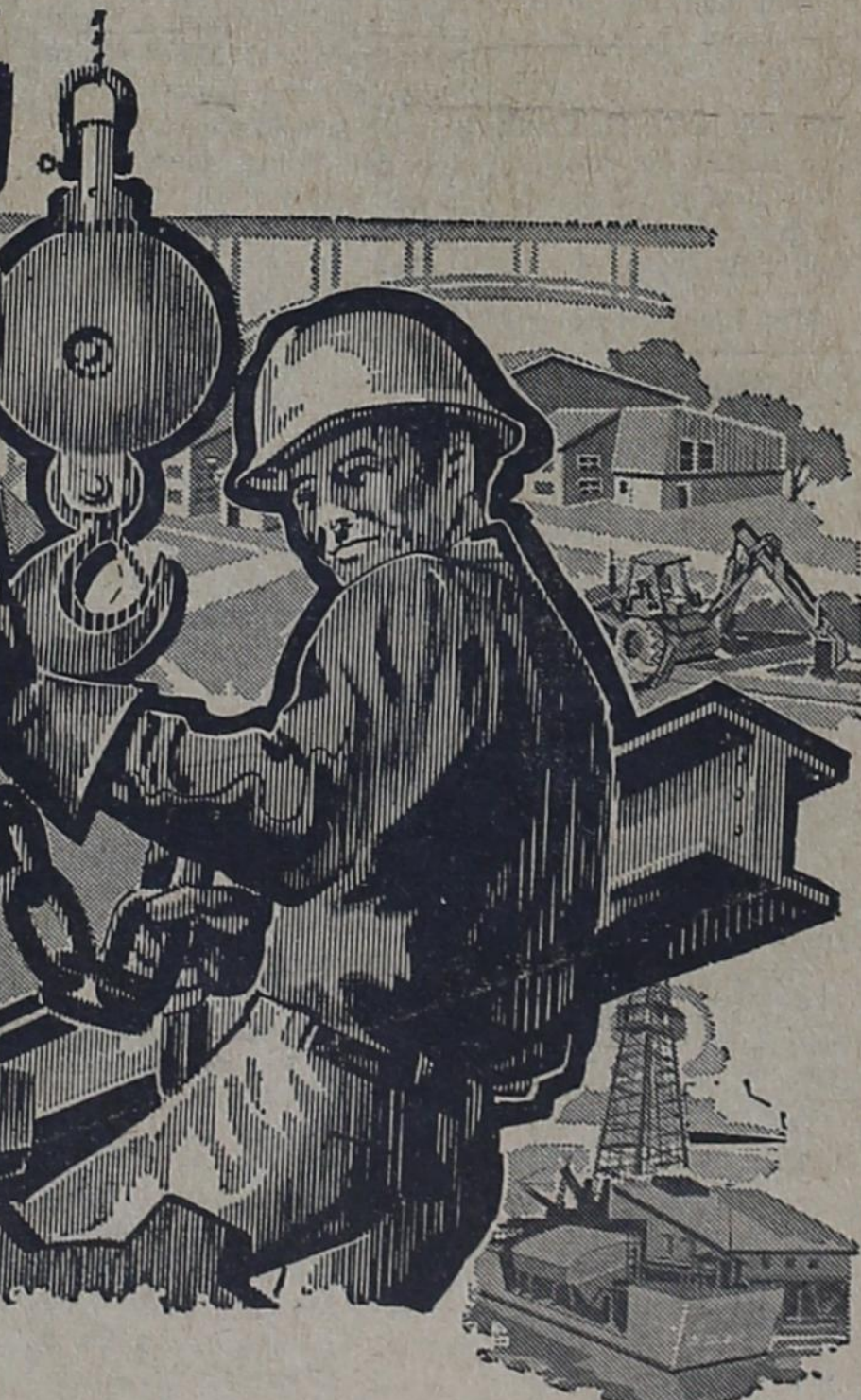

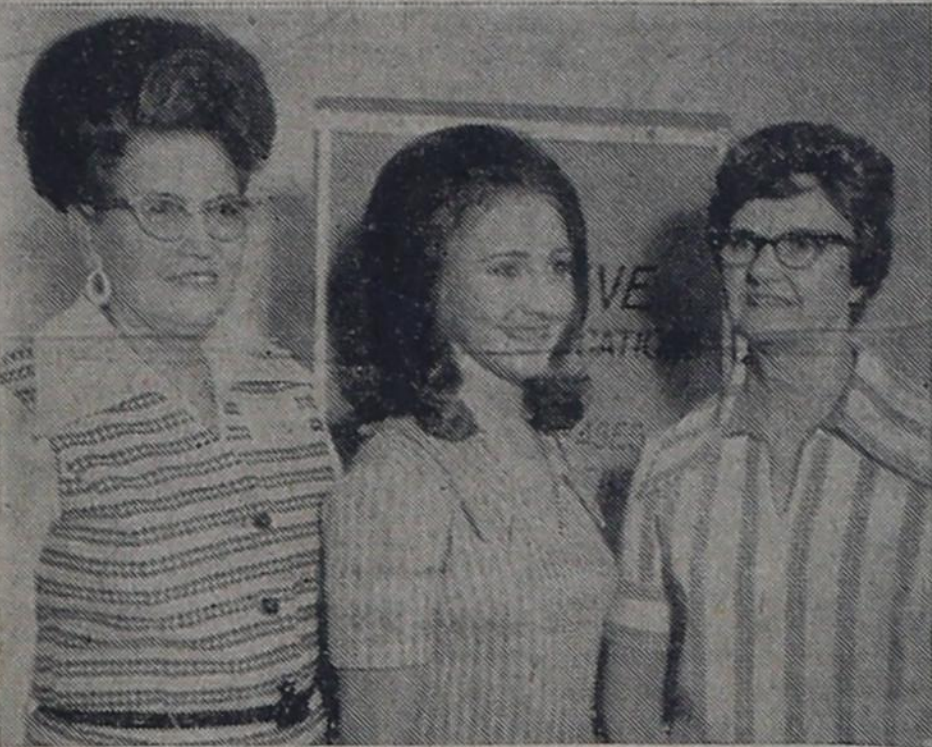

**Social Security To Come Early In September**

Some 90,000,000 Social Security Checks will have an unusual date on them next month - September 1st, according to R. R. Tuley, District Manager in Abilene. The usual date is the 3rd of a month except when that

is Sunday, in which case Saturday's date - the 2nd, is used. Since in September of 1973, Labor Day comes on the 3rd making the 2nd fall on Sunday, it was decided to use September 1st. Thanks to the cooperation of the Treasury Department and the Post Office, some 50,000 beneficiaries in the Big Country should get their checks for August two days early.

**COUNTY FARM BUREAU PERSONNEL ATTEND SECRETARY CONFERENCE**

Mrs. Ann Justice and Mrs. Pat Maynard of Eastland, office secretary for the Eastland County Farm Bureau, attended a state-wide school on August 19-22 in Waco.

The four-day County Farm Bureau Office Secretaries Conference was conducted by the Texas Farm Bureau. Classes and general sessions were in the Waco Plaza Inn. The final session was held in the Texas Farm Bureau's new \$2.7 million headquarters building. The 79 secretaries attending the training conference also toured the new facility.

Texas Farm Bureau President J. T. (Red) Woodson welcomed the secretaries at a banquet on the first evening. Others speakers at the conference included the Rev. Marshall Edwards, pastor of

the Columbus Avenue Baptist Church in Waco, who spoke on "The Problem of Potential," and Warren Newberry, Texas Farm Bureau Executive Director, who talked on "The Keys To Success."

Farm Bureau state and national staff members were instructors for courses on motivation, insurance services, communications, membership procedures, financial records, role of the office secretary, and insurance services.

General session topics included Farm Bureau structure group purchasing programs, membership progress, 1973 accomplishments and activities, constitution revisions, decision points in Farm Bureau, and the role of the county president.

**Texas Farmers 'Blackjacked' By Federal Program**

Texas Farmers Union President Jay Naman of Waco blamed low farm program price support levels for millions of dollars of losses which Texas farmers have sustained by future contracting. In a statement released from the Waco office, he said that Texas farmers have been "blackjacked" into contracting by the failure of the federal farm program to protect farm income.

"Farmers have sold too cheap or have contracted too low because their costs are high and price support levels are so low that they discourage orderly marketing. Farmers are forced by their financial obligations to resort to the security of a future contract, because the farm program does not provide a realistic floor under their prices. Much of the Texas cotton and feed grains has been sold at levels substantially below present market prices," Naman said.

"The traditional function of the Commodity Credit Corporation loan, to protect farm

prices at harvest time and to encourage a farmer to market in an orderly manner, was destroyed in the weak 1970 Farm Act and the low levels set by the new administration. The new farm program is just as objectionable or worse, and gives the Secretary the discretionary power to continue his low price support policy," according to the state farm organization president.

Naman pointed out that the charges and countercharges between the farmers and buyers are failing to focus on the shortcomings in the commodity marketing system which encourages uncontrolled speculation and erratic farm prices.

"Farmers Union has put together a task force on domestic economic problems and foreign trade to work on improving the present system of marketing farm products. Our task force members, farmers from across the state, will be meeting regularly during the fall and winter to work out a better marketing system and to devise better ways of forecasting both domestic and export markets," Naman said.

**Tips for using electricity efficiently:**

**Resist the temptation to set your thermostat lower than you need to.**

Air conditioning engineers recommend that thermostats be set at 76 to 78 degrees for comfort and economy. Every degree below this requires units to work harder and use more electricity.

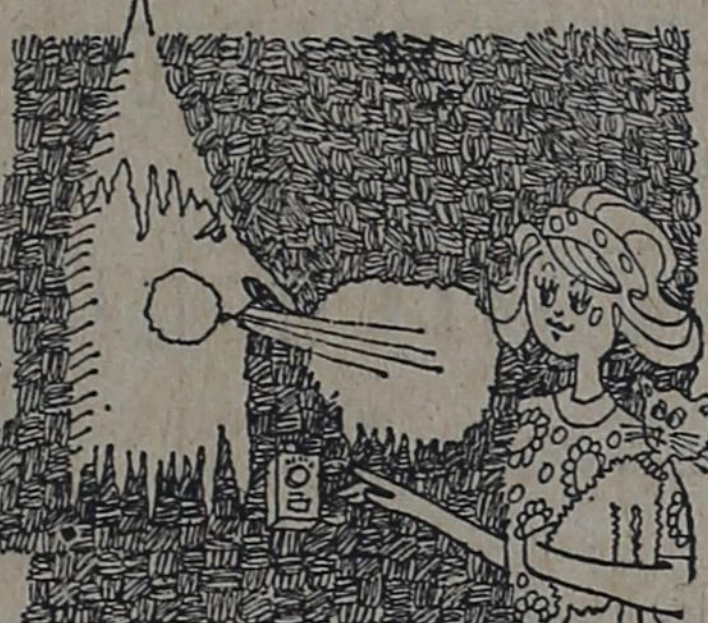
However, if you plan to be away all day, you can economize by raising the setting five degrees. Turn off the unit when you go on vacation, unless there are items that might be damaged by the heat. If so, leave the unit on, but raise the setting at least five degrees.

Here are some other things you can do to keep your costs as low as possible:

Enjoy cleaner air and lower costs by keeping the filters clean. A dirty filter causes the unit to work harder. Check them at least once a month. If it's a permanent-type filter, clean it according to the manufacturer's directions. Disposable filters should be replaced at least every 90 days, or earlier if necessary.

Also, keep out direct sunlight with awnings, blinds or draperies. Weather-strip doors and windows, and properly insulate walls and ceilings. Be sure the fireplace damper is closed. And, when possible, bathe, cook and do the laundry during cooler parts of the day to prevent heat buildup.

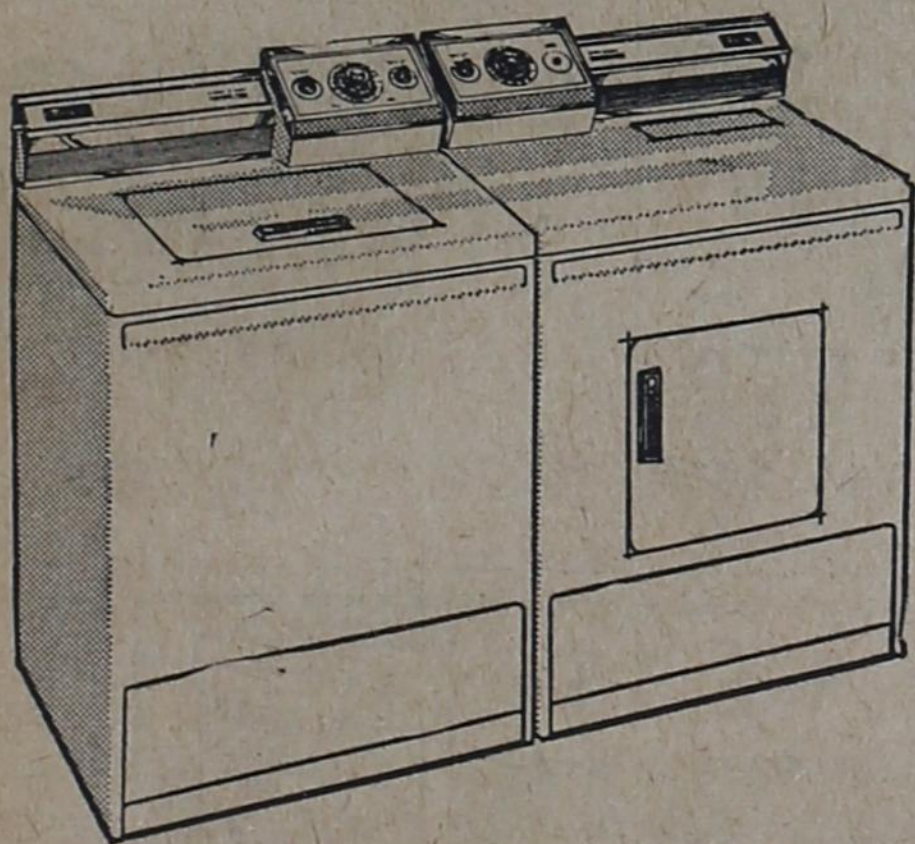
