

lugs, spikes, etc., upon county roads. It was pointed out that the operation

of such vehicles or equipment causes damage to the roadway and in some

instances there have been good county roads torn up to the point which ne-

cessitated much more costly repairs than just a grading to eliminate the bumps

for other persons traveling upon the road. It was also noted that the operation

of a vehicle or equipment with metal wheels, tracks, lugs, spikes, etc., upon

a county road is as much a violation of the State law as if the act had occur-

red upon a paved highway, and the penalty for such violation is a fine from

such vehicles or equipment upon the county roads and to move such vehicles
